<u>CHEM 5560 students:</u> There will be two mid-term exams (2 x 20 = 40 points), quizzes (20 points), and a final exam (40 points). A term paper about a topic approved by the instructor will be mandatory and will be graded as "satisfactory" or "unsatisfactory". The final letter grade for the course will be based on the total points of the exams and term paper. A "satisfactory" grade in the term paper will not affect your course grade while an "unsatisfactory" grade will discount 10 points from the course grade.
