Course Description: 4 hours. Limits and continuity, derivatives and integrals; differentiation and integration of polynomial, rational, trigonometric, and algebraic functions; applications, including slope, velocity, extrema, area, volume and work.

Prerequisite(s): MATH 1650; or both MATH 1600 and MATH 1610.

Recitation: Twice a week you will have a required meeting with a teaching assistant (TA). Your TA will do extra examples, answer questions about homework problems and possibly cover new material. There may be equally weighted quizzes (announced and unannounced) and in-class activities (typically group activities) in recitation which will make up 10% of your final grade. These can not be made up if you miss them and you must attend the recitation you are enrolled in to receive credit.

Calculator Policy: TI-83, TI-84, or equivalent, their use will be supported in class. Examples of calculators not allowed: TI-Nspires, TI 92's or any other utility with alphanumeric/CAS capabilities ARE NOT permitted, nor are any devices which are capable of connecting to other devices wirelessly or connecting to the internet. A calculator may not be shared during an exam.
