Course Description:

This is a 100 % Internet course. The focus of the course is to apply the theories and research on leadership to developing leadership in each person taking the course. Students will actually have an opportunity to be a member of an organization committee and apply the knowledge and skills of the course by using Blackboard IM.

Students who have received credit for this course as an undergraduate may not retake it for graduate credit.

Course Objectives:

A student who has successfully completed the course should be able to:

Identify and analyze theoretical bases of leadership

- Examine and apply enduring insights and research on leadership.
- Identify personal characteristics associated with various leadership styles.
- Define and practice leadership skills needed by volunteer managers.

Student Evaluation Procedures:

Students will be required to do the assignments described below:

<u>Autobiographical Qualitative Research Technique (AQRT)</u>:

As they read chapters in the Northouse book, students will develop a 1-3 paragraph self-analysis of their own leadership drawing upon the course material and especially the completion of the exercises. This autobiographical analysis will be placed in the discussion board area of Blackboard Learn and visible to others in the class.

Discussion Board:

There will be weekly discussion boards in which students are expected to participate

Team Leadership Experience:

This course in past years required students to observe a committee of a nonprofit organization and volunteer 10 hours of their time. This requirement is replaced with the Team Leadership Experience using the student organization Engaged Beyond Borders as a learning laboratory. Students will participate and provide leadership in online committees of Engaged Beyond Borders. Student grades are based on their participation and leadership contribution to their assigned committee as well as on a paper analyzing the leadership of the committee.

Exercises:

There are questionnaires at the end of each chapter in the Northouse text. These are to be completed and submitted as requested. The results are for your personal enlightenment regarding your leadership style.

Exams and Quizzes:

There will be 11 multiple choice, timed quizzes on the Northouse chapters. Students may take them as many times as they wish during the time period that the quizzes are available. This design makes them both an assessment of student knowledge and also a study aid.

A midterm exam (100 points) and a comprehensive final exam (200 points) will be comprised of multiple choice and short answer essay questions.

Course Writing:

All writing must utilize the American Psychological Association (APA) Style Guidelines. A good resource on APA guidelines is found here:

Use these guidelines for writing the Team Analysis Paper and citing references. Also use them for other writing on the discussion boards such as the case studies.
