Catalog Description

Beginning course providing a combination of lecture and studio with an introduction to photographic materials, techniques and digital cameras.

Course Structure

This is a studio class. You will be expected to plan ahead and work during class time. Generally class time will be split evenly between lectures and studio time. There will be four critiques, and 8 technical assignments/ quizzes.

Textbook and Readings

There will be no textbook for this class. Lynda.com videos will be assigned that correlate with in class demos. As part of you CVAD course fees you have access to lynda.com account. Please make sure your account is activated and that you are able to login.

Other readings may be assigned throughout the semester.
