#### **COURSE OBJECTIVES**

This course is designed to teach the fundamentals of television news producing in a station-like environment. The course offers theoretical and practical application of basic skills needed to function in an entry-level television news producing position. The course will also provide information and discussion in areas of journalistic ethics; basic management skills; and working with on-air talent. This course is geared toward people who wish to become news and informational television producers and create a solid career in television news and information media.

 Content: Television information/news writing; Story structure; Newscast formats; Crafting a quality newscast; Producing newscasts; Critiquing your work and that of others; Writing teases and headlines; Blocking newscasts; Understanding your real audience; Understanding the role of talent; Ethics and your commitment to the truth; Exposure to media professionals and real-world discussions.

- Access to a computer. Specific in-class assignments will be accepted in handwritten form. All others WILL NOT. You may email assignments to me as well if cleared first. Please use WORD as your format.
- Lab Assignments: 3.5 hours of lab work per week producing NTTV newscasts. You may also volunteer for any newscast or other NTTV production.
