#### **ELEMENTARY CHINESE- MWF**

# **Required Materials:**

3 books: *Integrated Chinese*, 4<sup>th</sup> Ed., Volume 1:

1. Textbook; 2. Character Workbook; 3. Workbook

<u>2 notebooks:</u> one for daily writing activities; the other for diary entries in Chinese 1 folder: for keeping papers returned to you till the end of the semester.

Course Objectives: This course is the second semester of an introduction to both the Chinese language and to the world cultures and societies where Chinese is spoken. We are adopting a holistic immersive approach, by which we mostly speak Mandarin 普通话 (with minimum English for quick explanations), creating a Mandarin environment to help you develop your language skills as well as cultural competence.

## **Prerequisites:**

Chinese 1010 at UNT (or the equivalent).

## **Requirements:**

- 1. Pre-Class work (Vocabulary Checks, 10; Grammar Exercises, 10; and **Reading Responses to Culture, DEI**, 5)
- 2. Post-Class work (Diary Entries, 10; Character Workbook, 10; and Workbook, 10)
- 3. Ouizzes (5) and Exams (4)

#### **Grading:** (**Please note:** Grades will not be curved.)

15% Attendance and daily participation (10% in class; and 5% in lab);

25% Pre-Class Work (Vocabulary Checks, Grammar Exercises, Reading Responses to Culture, 1% each);

30% Post-Class Work (Diary Entries, Character Workbook, and Workbook, 1% each);

10% Quizzes (2% each);

20% Exams (Oral Exams, Written Exams, 5% each)

**Attendance and Participation:** Regular attendance is essential. Leaving class 10 minutes or more before the end of the period is considered an absence. Up to 3 unexcused absences are allowed without penalty. 12 or more unexcused absences result in a failing grade for the course. Participation in class is the key to success in this class.

**Please note:** This course is a face-to-face class and joining Zoom does NOT count as attendance unless you need to self-isolate or quarantine because of COVID-19.
