

INTERMEDIATE CHINESE - TR

Required Materials:

3 books: *Integrated Chinese*, 4th Ed., Volume 2:

1. Textbook; 2. Character Workbook; 3. Workbook

2 notebooks: one for daily writing activities; the other for journaling in Chinese

1 folder: for keeping quizzes and other papers returned to you.

Approaches: This course is the first semester of a two-semester intermediate-level of Chinese. It is designed to reinforce what you have learned in previous Chinese courses and to improve your listening, speaking, reading, and writing skills and cultural competence for your advanced study. We are using a wholistic immersive approach to learning Chinese, with a focus on cultivating students' interests and self-directed learning in class.

Prerequisites: Chinese 1010/1020 at UNT (or the equivalent)

Requirements:

1. Journal entries (At the end of each class)
2. Workbook and Character Workbook (6: L11-15; Bring It Together L11-15)
3. Quizzes (5; Completing both your workbooks will qualify you for the quizzes.)
4. Oral exams (2) and Written exams (2)

Final grades will be determined as follows:

- 15% Journal entries, attendance, and daily participation;
- 30% Homework (5 in total, 6% each: 4% Workbook+2% Character Workbook);
- 25% Quizzes (5% each);
- 10% Oral exams (5% each); and
- 20% Written exams (10% Mid-term, 10% Final)

Regular attendance is essential. Leaving class 10 minutes or more before the end of the period is considered an absence. Up to 3 unexcused absences are allowed without penalty. 12 or more unexcused absences result in a failing grade for the course. **Cellular phones and other devices can ONLY be used when requested, otherwise cellphones must be kept out of sight.**

Note: Assignments are due on the day they are listed on the syllabus below. Late assignment will result in 10% loss in grade each day till the entire grade is lost (10 days after the homework due date). This penalty can only be avoided if students with valid, verifiable excuses make arrangements with me **before** the due date.

Quizzes and Tests: Students have opportunities to make up alternative quizzes covering the same material with the tutors with the approval from the instructor. For tests, however, there will be NO make-up tests unless cleared with the instructor. Taking the Final Exam is mandatory to receive a passing grade in this course. An alternative final exam is given **ONLY** to students who have an exam conflict. Appeals to reschedule a final exam must be made to your academic dean before the deadline.

Academic Honesty: During a test or quiz, students are required to remain in the classroom before completing the exam. Under no circumstances will a student leave the classroom and return to finish the exam. No small translators, dictionaries or any electronic devices are permitted. "Cheating on examinations and quizzes is dishonest." (p.19, *UNT Student Guidebook*). The mere suspicion of cheating will be grounds for receiving a zero on any exam, paper, or project.

Class Materials for Remote Instruction: Remote instruction may be necessary if community health conditions change or you need to self-isolate or quarantine due to COVID-19. Students will need access to a webcam and microphone to participate in fully remote portions of the class. Recordings: Synchronous (live) sessions in this course will be recorded for students enrolled in this class section to refer to throughout the semester.
