ADVANCED TOPICS IN CULTURA - MW

Required Materials:

2 notebooks: one for daily writing activities; the other for daily journal entries in Chinese

Approaches: This course is the first semester of a two-semester intermediate-advanced level of Chinese. It is designed to reinforce what they learned in previous courses and apply Chinese in cross-cultural context. We are using a wholistic immersive approach to learning Chinese, with a focus on building students' cultural competence in the Chinese-speaking world.

Prerequisites: Chinese 2040/2050 at UNT (or the equivalent)

Requirements:

- 1. Journal entries (At the end of each class)
- 2. Exercises (8; Completing both your workbooks will qualify you for the quizzes.)
- 2. Quizzes (8)
- 3. Oral exams (2) and Written exams (2)

Final grades will be determined as follows:

16% Journal entries, attendance, and daily participation;

32% Excercises (4% each);

24% Quizzes (3% each);

10% Oral exams (5% each); and

18% Written exams (9% Mid-term, 9% Final)

<u>Regular attendance is essential.</u> Leaving class 10 minutes or more before the end of the period is considered an absence. Up to 3 unexcused absences are allowed without penalty. 12 or more unexcused absences result in a failing grade for the course. Participation in class is the key to success in this class. Cellular phones and other devices can ONLY be used when requested, otherwise cellphones must be kept out of sight.

Note: Assignments are due on the day they are listed on the syllabus below. Late assignment_will result in 10% loss in grade each day till the entire grade is lost (10 days after the homework due date). This penalty can only be avoided if students with valid, verifiable excuses make arrangements with me **before** the due date.
