Purpose: This recitation is to support a learning environment and supplement your lecture course.

Grading

This recitation will be computed as 10% of your final grade in the lecture course.

Grading Criteria

- 2 points for active participation in each class session

Grading for Participation

‘Showing up’ does NOT constitute “Attendance.” Attendance requires active participation and will be measured in different ways depending on the goal each class. At a minimum, to receive credit for attendance you must arrive to class by the start time and work the entirety of the class period. Each class meeting will incur 2 points. You will lose points for being disruptive, being late or leaving before released. Please be aware that written assignments may be used to track attendance.
