Course Description:

This course studies the properties of subsurface materials and the principles of subsurface construction. Topics include soil classification and testing, soil mechanics, and foundation systems.

Course Objectives

- Understand the soil reports as they apply to construction.
- Understand ASTM soil testing methods.
- Understand the concepts of soil compaction and excavation.
- Understand the importance of moisture content in soil strength.
