### **SEARCH MORE THAN 1,000 FREE CONCERTS TO FIND EVENTS IN EVERY BOROUGH**

**Make Music New York**, the largest annual music festival in the city, announces its full schedule today at [www.makemusicny.org](http://www.makemusicny.org). The festival's seventh installment, taking place on Friday, June 21st, brings a characteristically diverse and exciting array of approximately **1,000 free outdoor concerts** in public, outdoor spaces throughout all five boroughs of the city, including parks, plazas, playgrounds, closed-off street blocks, piers, and even the Newtown Creek Wastewater Treatment Plant.

MMNY's website features a vibrant new look courtesy of legendary designer/illustrator Seymour Chwast, co-founder (with Milton Glaser) of the renowned Push Pin Studios.

The site is easy to use, enabling music lovers to search for concerts in genres from Bluegrass to World, across 57 neighborhoods from Astoria to Williamsburg. From the top of the alphabet (Academy in Inwood) to the end (Zdub in Midtown), a perusal of the site uncovers tantalizing gems of every musical description. While locations such as Central Park and McCarren Park continue to be popular, you'll also find brass in the Meatpacking District, a gamelan in DUMBO, funk in Staten Island, a bucket orchestra in Corona, and hip hop in libraries across the Bronx.

As always, many shops and restaurants are hosting music in front of their businesses. The Bushwick Coffee Shop will feature nearly twenty bands ranging from indie folk to synthrock. The Harlem Tavern will dance with groove-oriented pop and R&B. And East Kingsbridge Medical and Dental in the Bronx will feature the healing sounds of Reggae.
