WESLEYAN CHAPEL**, on **WEDNESDAY** Evening next,
AUGUST 1st, 1838, **PRECISELY at 7 o'Clock.** Addresses in both
Languages will be delivered on the auspicious occasion.

The attendance of **ALL** that feel interested in the welfare of
800,000 of their fellow-creatures who will shortly emerge from a
state of **SLAVERY** into that of **FREEDOM**, is most earnestly requested.

Carmarthen, July 30th, 1838.

P.S.---A Collection will be made to defray the local expenses of the Carmarthen Anti-Slavery Society, and to aid the General Committee, in London, in their important and unwearied labours, to secure to the Negro the possession of **ACTUAL**, as well as **NOMINAL** Freedom.

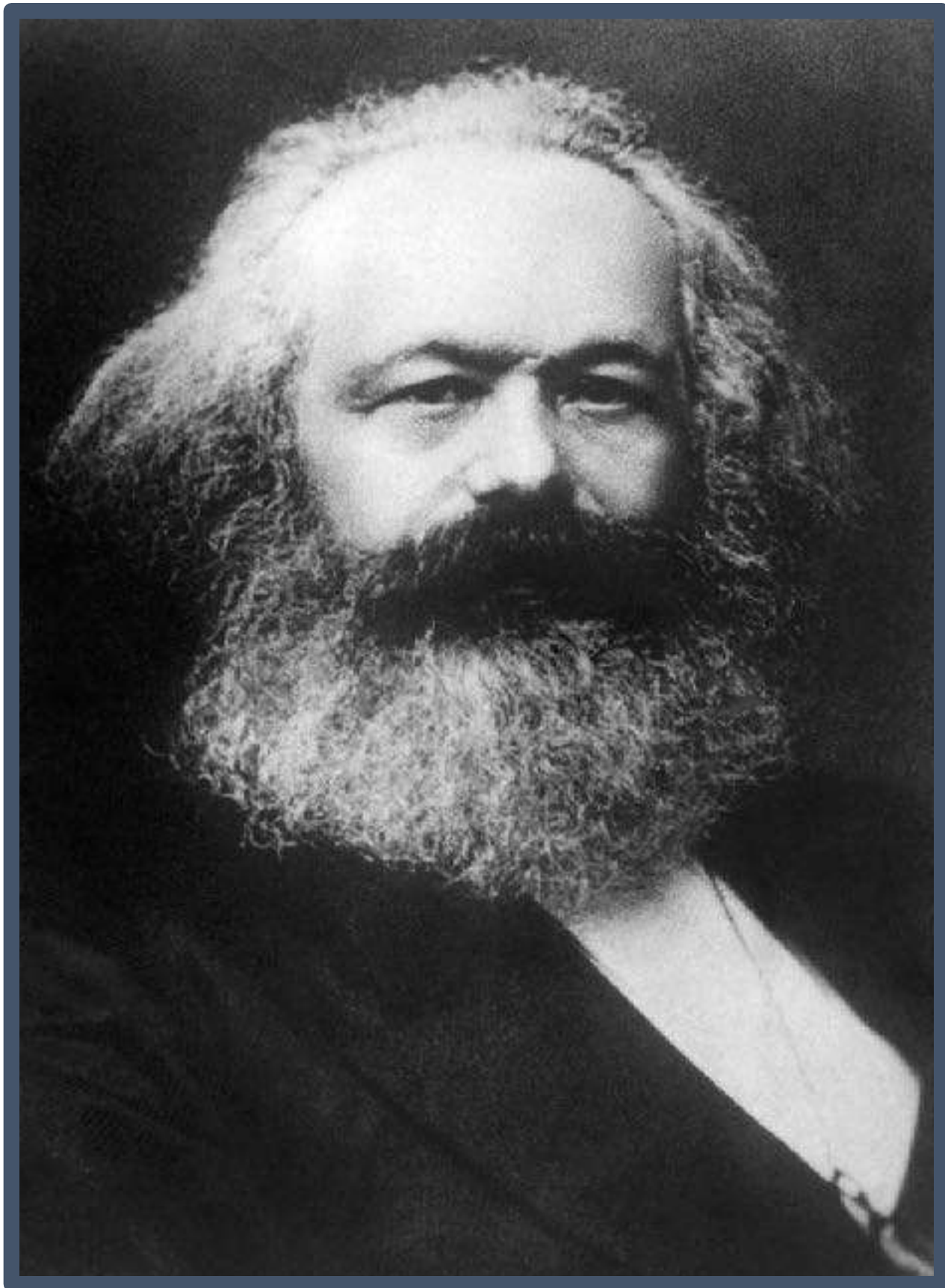

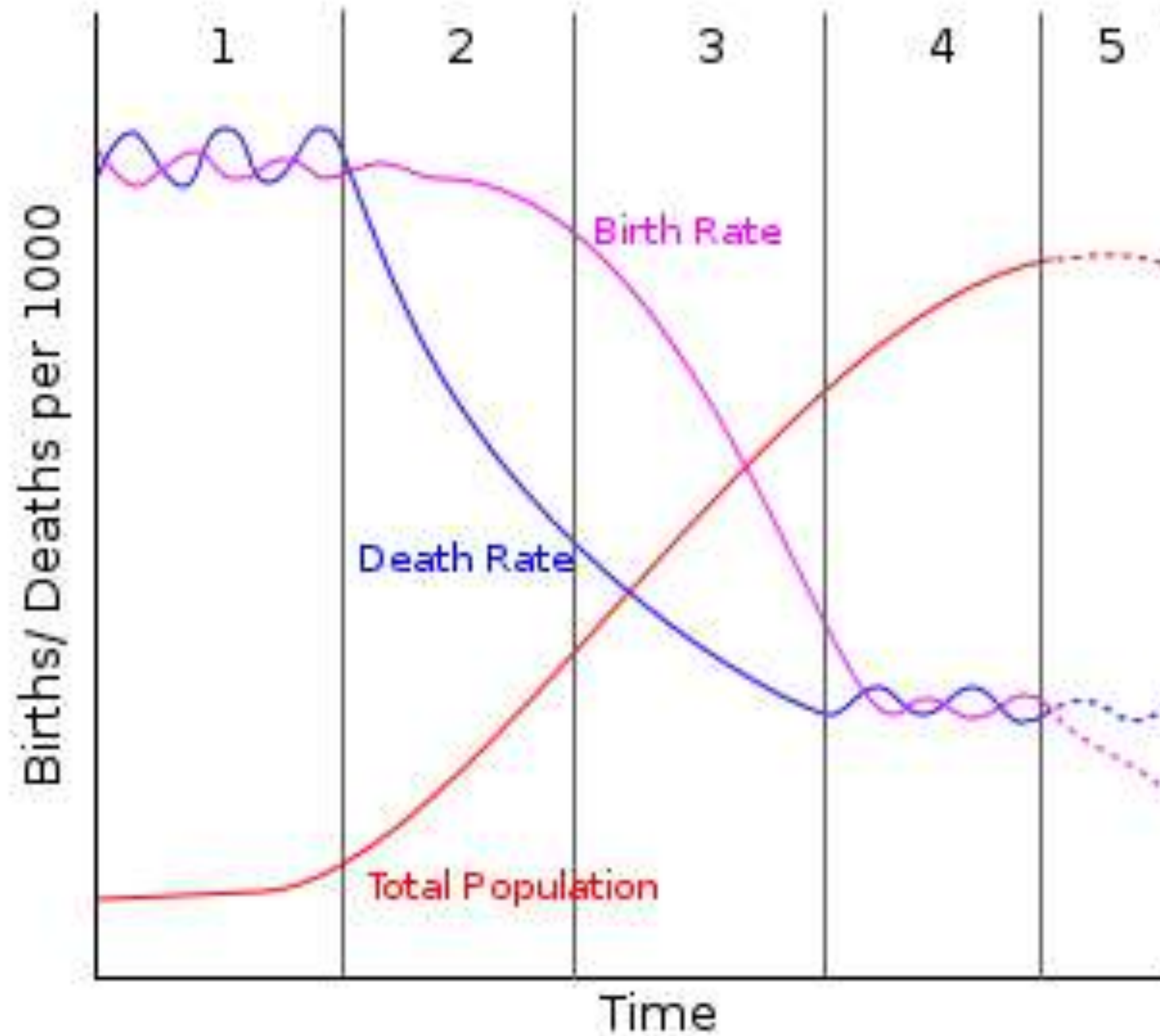




Population pyramid

1. Congress shall make no law respecting an establishment of religion, or prohibiting the free exercise thereof; or abridging the freedom of speech, or of the press; or the right of the people peaceably to assemble, and to petition the Government for a redress of grievances.
