How do we Pray in a Crisis?

- 1. Study the Scriptures and let God Speak to You about Your Crisis first, before you speak to Him.
- 2. Focus your attention on God and Seek Him by Prayer and Petitions.
- 3. Let God see how important, whatever you're praying about, is to you.

4. Pray the Promises of God– Daniel's prayer is based on God's Promises in Jeremiah 29:10-13

What is a Promise?

- A promise is a commitment to do something later.
- God's Promises are <u>commitments</u> that God has made to do some things.
- God's Promises can be general or specific.

- <u>General Promises</u> are promises given to every believer in every age.
 - o *Psalm 1:3*
 - o John 4:13-14
 - o 1 John 1:9
- <u>Specific Promises</u> are promises given to specific people on specific occasions.
 - o 1 Kings 9:5
 - o Luke 2:35
- Some <u>specific promises</u> are also applicable to every believer.
 - o Isaiah 54:10
 - o Acts 13:47

When Praying God's Promises, keep the following principles in mind:

- 1. God's promises are often conditional, so look for the word "if" in the context.
- 2. Praying God's promise does not make God give in to our will but help us to pray according to his will.
- 3. Don't presume to know precisely when, where, or how God's promises will be fulfilled in our lives.

How do I pray the Promises of God?

2Corinthians 1:20 (MSG) Whatever God has promised gets stamped with the Yes of Jesus. In him, this is what we preach and pray, the great Amen, God's Yes and our Yes together, gloriously evident.

God is so faithful that His promises all always yes (true). So we pray God's promises by saying Amen!

Read the Promise and declare "may it be so", simply say Amen!

Conclusion

- God promised that His love will never fail (1 Chronicles 16:34).
- God promised comfort in our trials (2 Corinthians 1:3-4).
- God promised blessing for all who will delight themselves in His Word (Psalm 1:1–3).
- God promised that all things will work out for good for His children (Romans 8:28).
- God promised peace when we pray (Philippians 4:6–7).
- Jesus promised rest (Matthew 11:28–30)
