²⁰ Then the LORD said, "Because the outcry against Sodom and Gomorrah is great and their sin is very grave, ²¹ I will go down to see whether they have done altogether according to the outcry that has come to me. And if not, I will know"

Abraham Intercedes for Sodom

²² So the men turned from there and went toward Sodom, but Abraham still stood before the Lord. ²³ Then Abraham drew near and said, "Will you indeed sweep away the righteous with the wicked? ²⁴ Suppose there are fifty righteous within the city. He answered, "For the sake of ten I will not destroy it." 33 And the LORD went his way, when he had finished speaking to Abraham, and Abraham returned to his place.

How do we maintain & regain unity?

Romans 12:18 says- "If possible, so far as it depends on you, live peaceably with all."

What is Paul telling us to think about?

Philippians 4:8- "Finally, brothers, whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is commendable, if there is any excellence, if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things."

++SACRAMENT++ CELEBRATION OF THE LORD'S SUPPER

As Lutheran Christians, as the Bible teaches, we believe that Holy Communion is a Sacrament, that is, a sacred act through which we receive spiritual blessings through faith. In the sacrament of Holy Communion, Christ gives to us His true Body and true Blood, in, with, and under the bread and the wine for the forgiveness of our sins and the strengthening of our faith. To receive this sacrament at Immanuel indicates that you believe what God has taught in the Bible regarding faith and salvation (a vertical fellowship with God) and share the same belief in matters of faith with those you commune with at the Communion rail (a horizontal fellowship with those with you in the church).

We also believe as St. Paul states in 1 Corinthians, Chapter 11, that each person "should examine himself", that is, be able to reflect on their need for this sacrament and be truly repentant of their sins (that is, desiring never to commit these sins again) and believe in Jesus as their Savior.

Christians commune not only as individuals but also as persons who share the same confession of faith as formally confessed in the host church. Since many denominations do not believe this, and if you are not a Lutheran church member, we ask that you speak with our Pastor or an Elder before you commune.

As you prepare to receive the Sacrament of Christ's Body and Blood for the forgiveness of your sins, prayerfully consider the following questions:

- 1. Do I believe I am a sinful human without hope of eternal life except for God's mercy in Christ Jesus?
- 2. Do I believe that Jesus is God's Son and my personal Savior?
- 3. Do I believe that He is personally present in the Sacrament of Holy Communion with His Body and Blood?
- 4. Do I desire, by the Holy Spirit's power, to live a Godly life?

WORDS OF CONSECRATION +WELCOME TO THE LORD'S TABLE!+ THE DISTRIBUTION

Please follow the usher's direction as you come forward for communion. Hold your cupped hands to receive the bread. Take and drink the wine when received. Please note: The communion cups on the outside of each tray are filled with white grape juice in consideration of those persons who, for medical or personal reasons, should not drink wine. Communion wafers contain wheat flour. For those who are sensitive to wheat products, please inform Pastor DuBois before Communion is served (ideally) or indicate that need during Communion. Gluten-free wafers are available at all Communion services.

PRAYER BEFORE COMMUNION: (Say silently to yourself) Dear Savior, I come to Your table at Your gracious invitation to eat and drink Your holy body and blood. Let me find favor in Your eyes to receive this holy Sacrament in faith for the salvation of my soul and to the glory of Your holy name; for You live and reign with the Father and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.
