Sermon Title: The Letter to Ephesus – Revelation 2:1-7

- I. Each of the seven letters reflects a relatively consistent pattern. Rev. 2:1
 - A. Addressed to the angel assigned to that specific church
 - B. Commendation
 - C. Rebuke
 - D. Solution
 - E. Consequences of disobedience
 - F. Promise for conquerors
- II. What's the significance of Ephesus?
 - A. It was a demographic center.
 - B. It was a spiritual center.
 - C. It was a port city making it a primary crossroads.
- III. A Church worthy of Praise, needing in correction and given a promise - Rev. 2:2-3
 - A. Jesus' Approval
 - 1. For works and labor (v. 2a)
 - 2. For steadfastness (v. 2b)
 - 3. For not bearing evil (v. 2c)
 - 4. For testing and rejecting false apostles (v. 2d)
 - 5. For bearing up and not fainting (v. 3)
 - B. Jesus' Accusation – You know the words, but not the tune – Rev. 2:4
 - C. Jesus' Admonition – Remember – repent – DO - Rev. 2:5
 - D. Jesus' warning sign to heed - Rev. 2:5b–6
 - 1. Your church, the candlestick will be removed (v. 5b)
 - 2. Your doctrinal purity is not enough (v. 6)
 - E. Jesus' Promise to the overcomer – Rev. 2:7
