They finally started sitting next to each other on the bus in high school and dating their senior year. Their first date was iceskating. His parents were upset when he gave Nancy his class ring. It cost \$36!

Allan and Nancy graduated together, got engaged, and were married June 20, 1975 in front of the Anoka County Court Commissioner. Allan credits caring teachers and his uncle for guiding him to a career in electronics. After living in three states for work, they returned to Blaine, and in 1979 started a family. As Nancy shared, many decisions were made without Christ and they felt something important was missing.

While purchasing a used pickup truck, a "religious" guy invited them to his church, close to their White Bear home. They started attending and learned about a personal relationship with Jesus. Allan and Nancy both accepted Christ and were baptized in August 1984. Their daughter and son both accepted Christ, and their family attended the church for 24 years. Nancy was blessed to share the Gospel with her mom and sister, and she rejoices that she will see them in Heaven someday.
