# $\overline{\text{Statement of Faith}}$ in Action



- We believe: Black lives have been disproportionately impacted by violence and oppression, with many cut short by acts of racism.
- We believe: Black lives have been treated as if they matter less in America for far too long.
- We believe: Racial oppression is the opposite of what God intends for humanity.
- We believe: The Church is called to denounce and oppose all forms of racism, discrimination, brutality, violence and oppression, particularly those reinforced by systems of power.
- We believe: People regardless of race, ethnicity, gender, ability, religion, age, or sexual orientation – deserve dignity, love, respect, freedom from degrading or violent treatment, and equitable access to social, educational, and economic opportunities.
