Top 10 characteristics of great parents:

- I. They prayed like crazy!
- 2. They had fewer rules than average!
- 3. They realized rules without relationship equal rebellion.
- 4. They were not afraid of their kids!
- 5. They helped their children discover their unique talents and didn't impose theirs!
- 6. They avoided sarcasm!
- 7. They prioritized relationships over experiences!
- 8. Their house was the hub!
- 9. They focused on spiritual transformation over behavior modification.
- 10. They did ministry with them!

Proverbs 19:18 (NIV)

Discipline your children, for in that there is hope; do not be a willing party to their death.

- 1. Make discipline a teaching moment more than a punishing moment.
- There is a difference between correction, punishment and discipline. (Ephesians 6:4)
- At the heart of discipline should be discipleship.
- 2. Make honor a priority in your home! (Exodus 20:12; Romans 12:10)
 - Honor, not obedience, is at the heart of all great relationships.
 - Without honor you will never have enough rules!
- 3. Make sure "dishonoring" behavior is met with discipline. (Proverbs 20:20; 22:15)

Dishonoring behavior: dishonesty, disrespect, disobedience

- Failure to discipline is actually dishonoring and deadly. (Proverbs 13:24)
- If you ignore dishonoring behavior you reward it, and what gets rewarded gets repeated!
- 4. Make sure discipline has a goal.
 - Goal of discipline is restoration of relationship.

Discipline takes:

- I. A goal.
- 2. Patience.
- 3. An apology and an opportunity!
- 4. Creativity.
