### Session Highlights July 27, 2022

The Session gathered in person and on Zoom, with elders joining from three time zones, and Elder Carolyn Verhoye joining from near Machu Picchu in wintry Peru! Also attending were several guests of the Renovation Task Force and the Capital Campaign Committee, who shared their proposals for the next steps in campus renovation. John Dominy, Domus Studios' principal architect, presented the latest concept plans for the renovation, which include development of open spaces in the campus center, and new construction and remodeling of the education buildings.

The Session endorsed the Capital Campaign Committee's motion to start development of materials that will help interpret the renovation projects to the congregation. The fundraising Steier Group will produce the materials.

Pastor Karla Shaw and Elder Gresham Bayne reported on challenges facing private preschools following the opening of state-funded free pre-kindergarten programs. But Bayne lauded the continued robust health of the church finances and projections, thanks to generous giving and efficient operations.

And the Session also thanked God in prayers for faithful leaders, inspiring plans, and the lives of cherished members and friends.

### "Is This a Good Time to Invest in the Endowment?"

Over the last few weeks, we have received variations of this question asking about timing a gift to the Endowment. My favorite version is the title for several reasons.

These questions all recognize that the stock markets have declined in recent months. One question was, "I have some unexpected funds just now, but should I wait to donate to the Endowment until the stock market goes back up?"

The answer to these questions is that any time is a great time to make contributions or bequests to the Endowment. When the Endowment receives funds, it invests those funds in the principal of the Endowment. The principal is invested for the very long term. As a result, there is an argument that when the market is low, as it is now, it may be an excellent time for many people to

contribute funds to the Endowment principal. That creates the likelihood of a more significant appreciation of the principal as the markets rebound. However, short-run market changes do not drive the Endowment because the principal of the Endowment is expected to last in perpetuity. As for income, the increase in interest rates may result in higher interest payments over the coming months (or years).

Of course, the answer to the question of timing very much depends on the donor's circumstances. Someone wanting to contribute cash will be in a different position than someone with stock that has temporarily declined in value. For example, the latter donor may decide it is better to wait until the markets have rebounded.

In short, while there may be individual considerations in deciding when the time is right to contribute to the Endowment, it is always a good time from the perspective of its benefits to the future work of the church.

"Is this a good time to invest in the Endowment?" is an excellent statement of the question because it recognizes that such contributions are always an *investment*. The Endowment exists as an investment in the future of the PLCPC and the future work of the church. It is always a good time to make such an investment.

# **Session Restructure Update**


Last December the Session decided to depart from its 60+ year old committee system and develop a new structure. A transition team was appointed to implement the changes. The goals were to: 1) create a more collaborative way of working among the Elders and church staff; 2) align with the four corners of the PLCPC mission (Experience Jesus, Journey into Deeper Faith, Strengthen the Church, Transform the World); 3) become more strategic, innovative, discerning and evaluative; 4) find more ways to shepherd, engage and empower more of our church family to live out our mission and vision, "Loving everyone to life with everything we have."

The Transition Working Group met for several months to develop implementation steps. This diagram was created using new language and a vision that describes the new structure. The four hot air balloons represent the elders and staff that lead the four mission teams. For example, the worship services and online ministries leaders are placed in the Experience Jesus Team. Mission Groups, fellowship groups such as Women's and Men's Ministries, and care ministries, such as Deacons are placed in the Strengthen the Church Team. Mission Support Groups that undergird and intersect with each of our four mission teams are the Management and Operations Group, and the Personnel Group.

The hot air balloon image demonstrates the mission teams' role to "float above" day-to-day details. They seek to

be more innovative, discerning and prayerful about God's leading while evaluating the effectiveness of current programs. This is a big change with MANY steps ahead! The Session believes in this new design, and we need your prayers for wisdom and patience, as change is never easy or comfortable.

At the June Session and Staff annual retreat we practiced this new design - a sort of test flight that we intend to fully launch this fall, when we ask the Spirit of God to "fill our balloons" as we take flight. Watch for the changes and join us! And, again, please pray as we embark on this journey!
