#### Session Highlights September 28, 2022

Capital Campaign Committee Chair Elder Pam Werner updated the Session on campaign progress at the Wednesday, September 28, 2022 Session meeting. Our development consultant, The Steier Group, has assigned PLCPC with a manager who lives in Coronado. This increased accessibility will allow more frequent consults and reduced expenses. The committee is now recruiting leaders for the campaign.

Renovation Task Force Chair Elder John Brand reported on meetings with the Quieter Home Project representatives. This program will install window and door modifications, insulation, heating and cooling, and other improvements to most of the campus, at no cost to the church. Installation is planned for the fall of 2023. The Session offered a prayer of thanksgiving for this wonderful benefit.

The Session took some time to discuss news of the community, and recent church events. Elder Katie Fulhorst reported on the election of Rev. Dr. Sean M. Chow as Executive Director of the Presbytery. Elder Jason Pritchett discussed the benefits of recent "active shooter" training, and additional tools and services available. Pastor Karla commented on the recent death of long-time member Rosie Rutherford. And Elder Kristin Stephany reported from Pensacola, FL, on the current status of hurricane Ian. The Session prayed for all these and other issues of concern and thanksgiving.

artifacts to fill up our local museums. But I have recently discovered archeology is more than just filling out history, it is actually an ever-changing landscape, constantly causing us to reconsider our most firmly-held beliefs about ourselves. Archaeologists examine change over time, seeking patterns and explanations. This gives us great insight into human behavior and also reveals to us that we have the capacity to break that behavior. I don't know about you, but after the few years we have just experienced, that gives me hope for the human condition.

This fall, from the sermon series, we are being challenged to listen more--to God, to the Scriptures, to Creation, to one another, and to ourselves--and this is similar to an archeological dig. Archeologists don't just take a shovel, find a random spot, and hope for the best. Rather they seek out specific places and spaces and learn to pay attention to clues along the way. In that search, which is far more directed than not, there is a greater chance they will discover treasures beneath the surface of the dirt.

If we hope to have movement in our lives and discover the treasures God has implanted in us, we also must seek out specific places and spaces and learn to pay attention (or listen) to clues along the way. God beckons us, not just wider, but deeper and teaches us that we also have the capacity to break past patterns of behavior. In this season, may God continue to unearth our souls and, in the process, knit us together through the change God desires to make in all of us.




