In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. The Word was with God in the beginning. Everything came into being through the Word, and without the Word not one thing came into being that came into being. What has come into being in the Word was life, and that life was the light of all people. The light shines in the bleakness, and the bleakness did not overtake it.

There was a man set from God, whose name was John. He came as a witness to testify to the light, so that all might believe through him. He himself was not the light, but he came to testify to the light. The true light, which enlightens everyone, was coming into the world. He was in the world, and the world was created through him; yet the world did not know him. To his own he came and his own did not receive him. But all who did accept him, who believed in his name, he empowered to become children of God – that is, those who were born, not of blood or of the will of the flesh or of the will of a human person, but of God. And the word became flesh and lived among us, and we have seen his glory, glory as of a parent's only child, full of grace and truth.

John testified by proclaiming, "This is the one I was talking about when I said, 'The one who comes after me ranks ahead of me, for this One existed before I did." Of this One's fullness we've all had a share – gift on top of gift. For while the Law was given through Moses, the Gift - and the Truth - came through Jesus Christ. No one has ever seen God; it is the Only Begotten, ever at Abba's side, who has revealed God to us.
