Advent marks the beginning of the liturgical year. With the first week in Advent, the liturgical colors in the sanctuary change to purple. Purple is commonly associated with royalty, so we use the color to symbolize the coming Lordship of Jesus Christ. We also use purple as the liturgical color for Lent. You might not think that Advent and Lent share much in common, but Advent also has origins as a time for repentance and fasting, one which lasted for forty days following St. Martin's feast day on Nov. 11.

In recent years, the use of blue vestments has become more popular for Advent. Many cultures view the color blue as symbolic of hope. Other Christian traditions use red or even gold in their Advent observances. You may have also noticed many Advent wreaths include a pink or rose candle. This candle is traditionally lit on the 3rd Sunday of Advent, commonly referred to as Gaudete Sunday from Latin word for "Rejoice". The rose color marks the transition from repentance and fasting to the joyful celebration of the Nativity.

The use of the wreath is a relatively recent addition to the Advent observance. The circular shape of the Advent wreath was a traditional pagan symbol that symbolized the change of the seasons. Although the use of the wreath for Advent may have origins in the 16th century, it did not become common until the 19th century in Germany. Early Advent wreaths had upwards of twenty-three candles, which were used to count down the days leading up to Christmas. Gradually it evolved into its present form, although Eastern Orthodox traditions use six candles, instead of four.

The term "Advent" comes from the Latin word *adventus*, which is often translated as "coming". *Adventus* is the Latin equivalent of the Greek word *parousia*, a word commonly associated with the second coming of Jesus Christ. And although we use this season to anticipate the future fulfillment of God's promises, let us not forget that we hold Advent as a *perpetual* observance. This season challenges Christ's disciples, to not only wait patiently in hope, but to also carefully consider how Christ is already among us, so that we may go out in search of him, wherever he may be!



On Wednesday, November 9th, 34 SPC women gathered for our monthly Celebration Circle meeting in the church fellowship hall. Carol Kauffman moderated our meeting.

Our Bible study leader, Vicki Chadwick, presented a passionate and enlightening lesson "Sabbath and Sunday" from this year's study book <u>Celebrating Sabbath</u>, <u>Accepting God's Gift of Rest and Delight</u> by Carol M. Bechtel. Following an explanation of the historical evolution of the day we presently call the Sabbath and set aside for worship, Vicki urged us to dig deep within ourselves and use all the amazing resources God has gifted us with to deal with circumstances in our lives that are challenging and sometimes seem impossible. She reminded us of the need for a healthy balance in our lives between work and rest.

We had an incredible week at our church as a Drop Off Location during National Collection Week!

Betsy Braddock reports that we had 21 volunteers who gave over 200 hours of service for OCC. Thank you to everyone that contributed to this mobile ministry! We delivered 2508 shoeboxes to Wilmington on November 21st. About 150 of these shoeboxes were from our congregation! On Second Sunday Funday, our youth packed 27 shoeboxes using the gifts we collected in the Narthex all year!

Mike Clawson offered to drive the giant Uhaul to Wilmington and he was overwhelmed to encounter a banner at the Central Drop Off at Freedom Baptist Church commemorating Susan. Shell Baptist, is one of the churches in which Susan began an OCC campaign about 9 years ago and they have brought in more than 800 shoeboxes each and every year since, AND, they have only about 120 members! This year, they dedicated their collection efforts to Susan. Susan Clawson brought OCC to our church many years ago, and we are grateful to carry the torch in her memory!

It was an especially poignant year for Mike and Drew Clawson as they remembered Susan, who passed away in May of this year. With Drew's permission, we share a Facebook post that says it all..

"Crazy how 4 years ago we were packing boxes together for Operation Christmas Child to now just Dad and I. My mom truly lit the torch in our area and inspired thousands to donate shoeboxes to be given to children in need all over the world by spreading the story of her faith and mission to everyone in her path. What is the purpose of the Columbarium?

The Columbarium consists of niches, uniform in size of the capacity to hold the cremated remains of 1 or 2 people. Each niche is covered with a granite plate, uniform in size, with a cast bronze name plaque with the name(s) and dates of birth and death of the deceased. Cremation after death is an increasingly popular choice considering lack of land for cemeteries and sustainable land use. Eat, Sing, and Do Some Good Let's Help Our Neighbors!




