The service begins at 8:00pm online.



Sunday Bible Study: Call in the New Testament

The Present Word (aka Alpha) adult Sunday School class continues to meet, albeit by Zoom in these days of Covid-19. We are beginning a new winter unit, *Call in the New Testament*. In December, "The beginning of a Call" will largely look at the early calls Jesus received for his ministry on Earth. The texts for this unit all come from the Gospel of Matthew.



We will follow this in January with "Jesus and Calls in His Ministry," with texts from the remaining Gospels.

The final five weekly studies are grouped within a topic that should be especially interesting, "The Call of Women." On January 31, the text from Acts generically refers to women who are called to prophesy. Then on each Sunday in February we will discuss a woman who had her own particular call; these are the Samaritan woman at the well, Mary Magdalene, Priscilla, and Lydia. We will learn about these through a variety of texts in the Gospels, Acts, and the Epistles.

Our class meets on-line, led by a rotating team of teachers, including one who continues to lead us after moving to Arkansas. Our class emphasizes group discussion and sharing ideas. We meet immediately after the 9:30am streamed worship service. CHRISTIAN OUTREACH

A Day of Caring at Avalon

The Hunger and Homeless team of WPC's Christian Outreach Ministry participated in the United Way's Day of Caring by helping at the Avalon Center. Avalon is a nonprofit organization in Williamsburg that provides shelter and support services to victims of domestic violence and sexual assault. Avalon is located in Williamsburg and in Mathews County.

Due to COVID 19, the Day of Caring turned into seven weeks of helping Avalon working in small groups to ensure the safety of our volunteers and Avalon's staff and clients. Our volunteers helped by removing vines growing on buildings, trimming tree limbs, weeding the playground and garden, edging walkways, washing the fences and siding of the buildings, and taking trash to the dump. The church had 9 volunteers who worked 11 days for a total of more than 80 hours.

Avalon's Residential Services Director, Karen Smalls, expressed her appreciation by saying: "Thank you so much for your volunteer work. Even though you're not in the spotlight, you are the backbone of what our agency represents, giving back and making a difference. Please know that we could not do this without your hard work. I am forever thankful for the time you have given us. You have made an unforgettable difference at the shelter and we appreciate your efforts especially during the state of our country's pandemic; you could have been anywhere but you chose us and we thank you."

The Kirk Krafters Go to Work

Thanks to the recent Outreach Survey, the Kirk Krafters of WPC are delighted to have a number of new members. A big welcome to them and to you, if you would like to join us! Currently, we are meeting on the second Tuesday of the month via Zoom.
