

Introduction: "James is concerned with helping us understand and persevere in the midst of our trials. The trials earlier in the chapter are probably related to persecution and mistreatment relative to the Gospel. The trials here are probably more general – the sorts of things that make you think, 'What is God thinking? Why does He do this or allow this to happen to me?'" (Rick Langer).
