George Bernard Shaw once said:

"The single biggest problem in communication is the illusion that it has taken place."

That can be very true! So, if you have ever had something you've said... be misunderstood! Or you've had something you've done... be misrepresented! Then you know how important it is to be clearly understood and fairly observed!

This is true in ALL human relationships but it is especially so in our relationships with each other as God's people - His Bride - the church.

Because this need for clarity in our communication and this unity in our mutual understanding is so critical to our relationships, Paul addresses this very thing in our passage for today.

The rewards we gain in heaven are not like the rewards we earn here on earth. We tend to think in material terms—mansions, jewels, etc. But these things are only representations of the true rewards we will gain in heaven. A child who wins a soccer trophy, treasures the trophy he receives not for the sake of the trophy itself but for what that trophy means. Likewise, any rewards or honor we gain in heaven will be precious to us because they carry the weight and meaning of our relationship with God—and because they remind us of what He did through us on earth. In this way, rewards in heaven glorify God and provide us with joy, peace, and wonder as we consider God's work in us and through us. The closer we were to God during this life, the more centered on Him and aware of Him, the more dependent on Him, the more desperate for His mercy, the more there will be to celebrate. We are like characters in a novel who suffer doubt, loss, and fear throughout the story, wondering if we will ever really have our heart's desire. BUT, when the happy ending comes and desire is fulfilled, there comes a completion. The story would not be satisfying without that completion. Rewards in heaven are the completion of our earthly story, and those rewards will be eternally satisfying"
