The Greek word most often translated as "joy" is *chara* and it means "delight or gladness based on the awareness of God's grace; grace **recognized**"

If "joy" is based on something that can't be taken away from you – grace that's been demonstrated to you through Jesus – then how can you say that some situation or person is "**stealing** your joy?"

koinonia can be defined as "involving **<u>mutual</u>** interests and sharing"

3. Your love for <u>others</u> is expected to grow and grow

Philippians 1:9-11

A love that grows in knowledge and depth of insight is the kind of love that not only deeply benefits others, but <u>purifies</u> and cleanses our own lives as we live in a thoughtful, growing love toward one another

What is a Home Group?

Home Groups are 8-15 people who meet regularly at different times and locations throughout the area. With our fast pace of life, it is difficult to slow down and build real relationships. Home Groups are a place to encourage each other, discuss what we're learning in the Bible, and share life's joys and challenges. Our commitment to one another

- Life-change. We pursue spiritual growth and life-change in community.
- **Building trust**. We value one another by being real, confidential, and listening to each other.
- **Being reliable**. Relationships don't happen without time together.
- **Open to all**. Every person matters to God and to us. We want all to know they belong here.
- **Trusting God**. God is real, personal, and active. We pray, believing He hears and answers.

Our theme for the year: "We are family."

Long before it was a pop song, Jesus made it clear that He was creating a family. The theme of being family continues throughout the New Testament. There, we are called "brothers and sisters" and taught how to love one another as God loves us. Our lead verse: "This is how we know what love is: Jesus Christ laid down his life for us. And we ought to lay down our lives for our brothers." 1 John 3:16

Special challenge for this series

The Bible is God's story, given to transform us and be an authority in our lives. For this series, we're encouraging people to memorize these key passages from the book of Philippians: 1:6; 1:21; 2:3-4; 2:14-16a; 3:8-9; 3:13-14; 4:6-7; 4:19-20.
