



Errett to Lead Mooreville Athletics

Mooreville, Ind. – The Mooreville Schools Board of Directors approved the appointment of Zach Errett as the next director of athletics for Mooreville High School. Errett has been the wrestling coach and assistant football coach at Mooreville as well as a science teacher at MHS since 2002.

“I am very excited for the opportunity to be the next director of athletics at Mooreville High School,” said Errett. “I look forward to serving our student athletes, coaches, administration, school corporation and community as we continue to build first class athletic programs.”



A screening team of school staff members, coaches, and district administrators took part in the interview process, choosing Errett from more than 50 internal and external applicants. The team recommended Errett at Tuesday evening’s School Board meeting.

“Zach Errett is the right person and leader to bridge our traditions of excellence into the future direction of Pioneer Athletics, inspiring a results-oriented culture of best possible, continuous improvement, and State Premier,” said Superintendent Brad Lindsay. “His combination of professionalism, attention to detail, and world class experiences in athletic competition will serve Mooreville, well making better happen for our student athletes, coaches, programs and greater school community.”

Errett’s athletic experiences have gone well beyond Mooreville. He is an active member of the U.S. Wrestling Officials Association and served as an official in several tournaments worldwide as well as the 2012 Olympic Games in London. Errett has also organized wrestling tournaments and clinics at the local as well as national level.

“Zach clearly stood out among the candidates for his visionary leadership and commitment to Mooreville,” said incoming MHS Principal Brian Disney, who added, “It’s obvious he will lead our athletes, coaches, and school community to great successes on the field, in the classroom, and in the community.”

Errett earned his Master’s Degree in Geosciences at Mississippi State University and his undergraduate degree in chemistry at IUPUI. As a wrestling coach, he was named 2006-7 Mid-State Coach of the Year and 2009-10 Regional Coach of the Year. His teams have had members at the state wrestling tournament seven of the past 11 years. Errett’s teams have also completed a wide variety of service projects for the community.

“Our goal is for our student athletes to not only excel on the field but also in the classroom and community,” said Errett. “I believe that future is bright for MHS and the athletic programs and I look forward to working with Mr. Disney as we strive to BE EPIC at Mooreville High School.”

Errett and his wife, Jill, have two children, daughter Bailey, 4, and son Ethan, 19 months.
