



Mooreville Memorabilia Benefits A Good Cause

With the renovation of Mooreville High School, some changes in the school have paved the way for a unique opportunity for community members to “own a piece” of MHS.

The MHS gym from 1959-1985 is being renovated and the original bleachers are coming out. In addition to the wear and tear the bleachers have had over the past 55 years, they are not designed for accessibility. School administrators and the MHS Alumni Association came up with a plan to use the old bleachers for a good cause.



The Alumni Association is making plaques from the bleachers, complete with a photo of the gym and “Mooreville High School Gymnasium 1959-1985” etched on each piece. Each plaque is unique due to scratches, bolt holes, paint and more.

The gymnasium was not only the site of countless basketball games and the home court of Mooreville’s Final Four girl’s basketball team in 1978, it has also been the spot for school plays, variety shows, the Wagon Trails Revue, dances, Post Prom, and other events through the years.

The plaques will sell for \$25 each and proceeds benefit the MHS Alumni Scholarship Fund, which benefits a graduating senior who is the child or grandchild of an MHS alumnus.

The plaques will be on sale beginning Saturday, April 26 at the MHS Building Tours (4:30-6:30p.m., enter door #29) and the MHS Alumni Banquet (6:30p.m.). Everyone will be able to pick the plaque they want. Make checks payable to MHS Alumni Association. Additional plaques will be on sale at the Mooreville Schools Education Center beginning April 28. The Education Center, located at 11 W. Carlisle St., is open weekdays from 8a.m. to 4:30p.m.
