Achievements of the Class of 2015, from Dr. Disney's Commencement Address:

In extra and co-curricular activities

- At the Indiana State Fair competition, the marching band finished 12th while the color guard and cheerleaders both finished 5th.
- The Business Professionals of America had a record number of students qualify for the state competition and one senior finished 6th at national competition.
- One senior earned honors at the National Journalism Education Write-Off Competition in Denver.
- The Wagon Trails Yearbook won the Hoosier Star Award for the 3rd consecutive year.
- Many students and groups including band, choir, orchestra, Spanish club, and Health Occupations, competed and performed well at local, regional, and state competitions.
- A member of this graduating class is the Best Buddies High School President of the Year for the state of Indiana.

In athletics

- Our girls' basketball team won their 7th consecutive sectional title.
- We had individuals who qualified for the state championships in wrestling and girls' track.
- Our teams and individuals broke numerous school records.

Through service

- They contributed hundreds of hours of community service volunteering with national, state and local school and community groups.
- MHS students raised money for many great causes including participating in the American Cancer Society's Relay for Life.
- Our Riley Dance Marathon set a new record by raising more than \$5,000.
- Last year, MHS was the first school to win the IHSAA's Champions Together Award.
- This year, we had an outstanding convocation and have raised more than \$10,000 in 2 years for Special Olympics.

In Academics

- Multiple students were named outstanding students at Area 31 Career Center, students of the month
- More than 50 graduating seniors have been awarded scholarships from many community groups and from 21 different colleges. These students are receiving more than \$1.8 million in college aide.
- 39 graduates have been recognized for their character, service, and academics as members of the National Honor Society.
- Nearly 35% of our graduates earned an Academic Honors or Technical Honors Diploma. These students maintained at least a "B" average while taking a more rigorous course load including additional math, science, and foreign language courses. These students also earned college credits and/or industry certifications for their work while still enrolled at MHS.
