



## Law Enforcement, Schools, Community Partner to Host Social Media Workshop

The Morgan County Sheriff's Department, with support from Mooresville Schools, the Reporter-Times, and the Mooresville Public Library, is hosting a workshop for families about cyber safety. "When Social Media Goes Bad" will discuss online safety issues including social media, cellphones, cyberbullying, online predators, and sexting. The workshop will be held Thursday, Aug, 27, at 6:00p.m. in the Community Room of the Mooresville Public Library.

Parents are encouraged to bring upper elementary through high school children with

them to the workshop. Families will learn about topics such as the danger of posting where you are and when, as well as taking photos and posting with active geo-locators on your phone. Topics will also include cyberbullying and when threatening behavior can have legal consequences. Social media programs such as Facebook, Twitter and Instagram will be covered, as well as lesser-known programs such as YikYak, Ask.fm, Snapchat, and other social online channels which are lesser-monitored by parents.

Families will be educated about how to monitor and understand cellphone and tablet features and options to monitor and filter electronic devices their children use. Families are welcome to bring cellphones and tablets along to see firsthand how to monitor settings.
