A new partnership was presented to the Mooreville School Board Tuesday which will provide career training for young adults and all community members in Mooreville as well as residents throughout Morgan County.

Those who meet a registration, testing, and scholarship process can qualify for classes in more than a dozen career fields free of charge. The partnership between Work One, Ivy Tech, Vincennes University, and the Wayne Adult Education provides local training in areas such as medical assisting, dental assisting, CDL-A and -B driver licensing, food services, education paraprofessional, and computer courses.
