Mooresville Receives \$50,000 Safety Grant

Mooresville Schools is the proud recipient of a \$50,000 matching safety grant from the Department of Homeland Security. This grant will allow Mooresville Schools to update all school, bus and safety personnel radios to digital. The funding will also purchase repeaters to get signal to remote school and bus locations, and provide additional cameras in school buildings.

Taylor Presents at Oxford

Mooresville Superintendent Randy Taylor presented to leading schools from across the U.S. and around the world at the International Round Table Symposium on Educational Issues and Trends at the University of Oxford in London this week. Superintendent Taylor presented about serving at-risk youth and the importance of establishing mentors, building relationships, and improving behaviors. The prestigious honor is awarded to school districts and administrators selected by an international committee of educators from K-12 and higher learning institutions.

Mooreville Schools Dominate Pounding the Playground

The top finishers county-wide in this spring's Healthier Morgan County Pounding the Playground program were three Mooreville schools. North Madison came in first with 13,595 miles walked, an average of 21.55 miles per student. Northwood came in a close second with an average of 21.48 miles per student. Waverly came in third. The top three schools were awarded with \$1,000, \$500, and \$250, respectively, to go toward the school's health and wellness purposes.

services to individuals, families and groups as well as training for teacher and staff on behavioral health issues. This is in addition to the Adult and Child counselors currently serving students at all seven Mooresville Schools.

“This is an important partnership for our students and our families,” said Mooresville Schools Superintendent Randy Taylor. “We know that providing these services will help strengthen our students and families as well as support our staff members as they strive to help every student reach his or her potential.”

Additionally, the Coach/Clinician will provide crisis intervention/prevention services, provide follow-up and re-integration assistance for students returning to school from hospitalization or treatment stays, and provide training for teachers and staff on behavioral health issues. Susie Hurt, Director of Special Education at Mooresville Schools, will oversee the program.

“Adult and Child Health is very excited about this opportunity to expand our support of Mooresville students and their families,” said Stephanie Yoder, MSW, Chief Operating Officer of Adult and Child Health. “We very much value this partnership and share in Superintendent Taylor’s belief in providing a healthy place where students can thrive.”

The Adult and Child Health partnership will also allow Mooresville Schools to become a pilot site for telehealth services for psychiatric prescribers.

Another component of the program will be the introduction of The Incredible Years curriculum for students from preschool through grade 3. The Incredible Years is a series of interlocking, evidence-based programs to address behavior issues and promote children’s social, emotional, and academic competence.

The programming will begin this fall.

2018-19 Vaccination Requirements: The Indiana 2018-19 Required and Recommended School Immunizations list has been released. Key changes from 2017-18 include:

- Hepatitis A (2 doses) is required for grades kindergarten, 4, 6, and 12 (doses must be 6 months apart).
- HPV has been added as a recommendation for grades 6-12.
- Annual Influenza vaccination is recommended for all ages.

VACCINATION REQUIREMENTS: All students entering kindergarten, 4th, 6th, and 12th grade are reminded that vaccination boosters are needed. Our vaccination deadline is September 4. Students may be excluded from school after that if they don't have proper documentation. The Franciscan Health Vaccination Clinic will be at MHS on Sat., July 28, 9am to noon to assist with vaccinations – register at 317-528-6374 to ensure we have enough vaccine. PARENT COMMUNICATIONS: Families who've updated their telephone numbers, email or other contact information are strongly encouraged to log into their child's Skyward account to update contact information. Schools are in the process of sending out Back to School information and we want to be sure all families get the updates they need.

TRANSPORTATION QUESTIONS: If you have questions regarding a bus route or bus arrival times, please contact our Transportation Department at 317-831-9220.

SCHOOL SUPPLIES: Elementary and middle school lists are available at www.MooresvilleSchools.org. High school supplies will vary by classes taken. Mooresville Schools' families in need of assistance should plan to attend our School Supply Distribution on Saturday, July 28, 9am – noon at Mooresville High School. Students are encouraged to attend so they can pick out their backpack – if your student cannot attend, please bring proof of enrollment such as a report card or letter from school. Those who would like to donate are encouraged to bring items or monetary donations to the Mooresville Schools Education Center in the weeks prior to the event. Items needed most include boxes of tissues, pencils, glue sticks, dry erase markers, loose leaf paper, and backpacks.

NEW ENROLLMENTS: You may begin pre-enrollment online at www.MooresvilleSchools.org and then will need to bring a birth certificate, shot records, and proof of residency to the school to complete enrollment. Please call your child's school to set an enrollment appointment (all offices are open beginning July 23) so we may get classes assigned and have everything ready for the first day of school.
