For the members of our Class of 2020, we understand your sadness as we come to what should be a time of celebration in your young lives. MHS administrators will work with senior class leaders to develop creative ways to honor your many achievements. Please know that our entire school community supports you now as we have throughout your educational journey.

Please be aware that our schools, playgrounds, and athletic facilities will also remain closed for the remainder of the school year beyond essential services such as our food service program.
