FACE COVERINGS REQUIRED FOR ALL PASSENGERS	

WAYS TO PAY YOUR FARE

- Front-door bus boarding resumes July 12
- Use contact-free fare payment: CharmPass, CharmCard or paper tickets
- Cash fares will be accepted

HOW WE'RE ENHANCING CLEANING

- MDOT MTA vehicles are disinfected daily
- Interior surfaces of Light Rail and Metro Subway vehicles receive additional midday wipe-downs
- High-touch surfaces at stations like ticket vending machines and fare gate readers are disinfected daily

WHAT RIDERS CAN DO

- Minimize unnecessary travel
- If you are sick, stay home, except when seeking medical care
- Be alert for fever, cough, shortness of breath, or other symptoms of COVID-19
- Wash your hands often with soap and warm water for at least 20 seconds
- Use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer with at least 60 percent alcohol if soap and water are not available
- Cover your coughs and sneezes with a tissue, your sleeve or your elbow
- Limit touching surfaces like seat backs, stanchion bars or handles
- Follow social distancing decals on Light Rail, Metro Subway and MARC Train platforms
