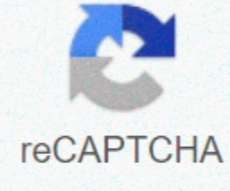

Catheter-based interventions in the treatment of Valvular Heart Disease (VHD) have increased over the past few years with the emergence of transcatheter Aortic Valve Replacement (TAVR), edge-to-edge mitral valve repair, and other research devices to repair or replace diseased valves.
