#### Governors 2022

- Only two governors were up for election in 2021 in New Jersey and Virginia. While New Jersey Democratic Governor Phil Murphy was able to hold onto his seat in a narrow victory, Virginia's governorship flipped from Democratic to Republican with a win by Glenn Youngkin.
- Overall, Republicans have gained one gubernatorial seat after the 2021 elections by flipping the open seat in Virginia. In 2022, Republicans will have 28 governors and Democrats will have 22 governors.




#### Governors 2022

Data as of 11/4/2021. In 2021, Republicans had 27 governors and Democrats had 23 governors. Only one state flipped in the 2021 elections (Virginia, which flipped from a Democratic governor to a Republican governor).





## Legislatures | 2022

- Only two states held legislative elections in 2021. In New Jersey, all 40 state senate seats and 80 assembly seats were up for election, while only the 100 house seats were up in Virginia.
- Republicans were able to flip one legislative chamber. While both chambers of New Jersey's legislature remained under Democratic control after the election, Virginia's House flipped from Democratic control to Republican.
- In 2022, there will be three split legislatures (that is, one chamber controlled by each party) in Alaska, Minnesota, Virginia. Alaska's House is controlled by a Democrat-Republican coalition.
- Democrats will control the legislatures in 17 states, while Republicans will control the legislatures in 30 states.




# Legislatures | 2022

Data as of 11/4/2021. The Alaska House is controlled by a Democrat-Republican coalition (both in 2021 and in 2022). In 2021, Republicans controlled 30 state legislatures, Democrats controlled 18, and 2 states had a split legislature. In 2022, Virginia's legislative control shifts from Democratic control to split control with the House flipping to Republican control.





## Trifectas 2022

- A political party holds a "trifecta" in a state when it controls both state legislative chambers as well as the governor's office.
- Democrats will lose one trifecta in 2022 (in Virginia). In 2022, Republicans will have 23 state trifectas and Democrats will have 14 state trifectas. Thirteen states will have a divided government.




## Trifectas 2022
