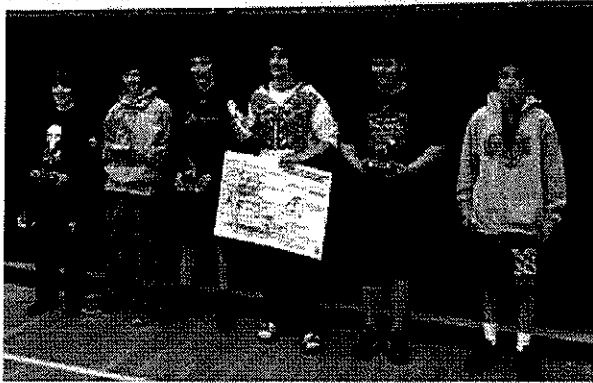


# Maryland Junior Wrestling League Perry Hall Punishers capture seventh place at States

## Punishers capture seventh at States

The Perry Hall Punishers took seventh place as a team and sent six wrestlers to the podium during the Maryland Junior League's State Championships.

The Perry Hall Punishers took seventh place as a team and sent six wrestlers to the podium during the Maryland Junior League's State Championships at North County High School in Anne Arundel County advancing 13 wrestlers to the tournament.

The Punishers' seventh-place performance in the team standings outdistanced all area teams, including Middle River, Golden Ring, Dundalk and Fallston.

Outstanding individual Punisher performances were turned in by the following:

**Hunter Yoakum**, who finished seventh, improving on last season's eighth place showing at 105 pounds. Yoakum will be attending Harford Vo Tech in the fall.

**Sonny McCauley** stepped up on the State's biggest stage and turned in a solid fifth place at 140 pounds. McCauley should be a starter at Archbishop Curley next season and be part of the attempt to bring that struggling program back to prominence.

**Tyler Klein** dominated all but one of his States matches, going 5-1 to take third place at 100 pounds and to finish his season with an incredible 54 wins. Klein is piece number two that will be attending Curley next season.

**Nolan Klado** turned in a solid performance at heavyweight, taking third place and scoring an incredible 45 match points in four matches at heavyweight.

**Camryn Grindle** added a Bronze Medal at States in addition to his MJWL championship earned last weekend and finished the season with 53 wins. Where Grindle will end up next season is to be determined, but he would be a solid addition to any program he chooses.

And finally the Punishers crowned a state champion in **Alec Blume**, who edged out his Severna Park opponent by a score of 5-4 to earn the 170-pound Championship. Blume is looking into attending school at Calvert Hall or Boys Latin in the fall.
