USA Folkstyle Wrestling Nationals results

In what was billed as the "War at the South Jersey Shore," local wrestlers traveled to Wildwood, N.J. to compete in the SJWA Nationals that featured 1,245 wrestlers from 15 states. Out of the 1,245 wrestlers, over 100 were state champions from their respective states.


The following local wrestlers placed "All American" Top 8:

- Josh Llopez (Middle River), 2nd place
- Mike Long (Kingsville), 4th place
- Greg Saumenig (Pasedena), 7th place
- Shane Milam (Middle River), 7th place

Bill Gialamas (Perry Hall) was the only Maryland wrestler to place in two divisions, taking fourth place and seventh place, winning six matches. It was the eighth time Bill has placed All American at a National event.

Nik Gialamas (Perry Hall) won the area's only championship in the high school 95-lb. class going 4-0 defeating state place finishers from Pennsylvania, New Jersey, New York and Delaware. He took the championship bout, 4-2 with .02 seconds left in overtime.

This was Nik's sixth National Championship that includes AAU Grand Nationals, Southern Nationals and USYWA Middle School Nationals, but this was his first as a high school wrestler.
