



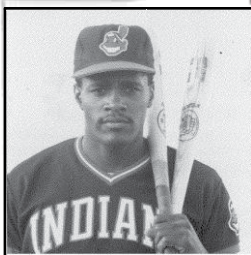

 - Prior to going to the major league Spring training his brother Nicholas trained him in their parents' garage with homemade implements. “We used bricks for weights, a homemade sawhorse for dips and a pipe for chins-ups. We did lots of sprints, drills and hitting. He said, ‘It was the best shape he had been in prior to a spring training’.”

EVERY day with the Kinston Indians in what Mike calls the “high” Class A was like Dionne Warwick singing “Déjà Vu.” And, like an unforgettable song, everything kept coming back.

Watching those kids play under the lights of Grainger Stadium, I was back at Gastonia, and it was 1973 all over again. There was Milt Harper, our slugging first baseman, tossing the ball to the other infielders at the start of the visitors’ at-bats. Milt’s left-handed, and his moves at the plate and in the field reminded me of Mike *his* second year.

Hearing Mike and Steve Comer (hasn’t Steve got the perfect name for a coach—aren’t we looking for just that, a comer*or two?) ... hearing those two buddies from the Texas Rangers days gab about how this guy had the tools but lacked the temperament to make the Big Show or how that one needed to shorten up his bat stroke or add another pitch, I caught myself speculating about how the Texas Ranger brass must have discussed Mike’s prospects after his award-winning 1973 season at Gastonia.

Mostly, though, I listened to the wives. In Batavia there were only two couples on our team. There were a half dozen

2013 Season Preview

The 2013 season has approached and at the same time Cajon is saying good-bye to the San Andreas League and is looking forward to compete in the power house Citrus Belt League for the first time in their tenure. The CBL consist of Redlands, Redlands East Valley, Yucaipa, AB Miller, Eisenhower and now Cajon. The San Andreas League has been part of Cajon's history since the beginning.

The SAL has been a league that has truly consisted of a wide range of schools throughout its 40 year history. It is an iconic league that has had teams from all over the Inland Empire. The league started in 1970 with teams such as Bloomington, Norco and Hemet; and now consists of teams such as Rialto, San Geronio, and Carter. Cajon High School was the only school to always remain in the San Andres League. We were there from the start and have played teams from the heart of the Inland Empire as well as teams from the High Desert and Low Desert, Barstow to Palm Springs. The pages that follow list all the schools that were once a part of the San Andreas League.

Cajon won its first league title in 1976 and did not win another one until 21 years later, in 1997. Following that, Cajon began to become an instrumental influence in the sport of baseball by winning several more league titles in 2004, 2005, 2007, and 2008. The SAL has always been home for the Cajon Cowboys but as we advent into a new league, new tradition, and the unknown, the Cowboys will always compete, adapt, improvise, and overcome any obstacles in order to prevail.

Going into the CBL, won't be easy but it is the best time for Cajon as we are returning seven starters from last season plus four starting pitchers. And out of those ten players, six will be part of the varsity program for three seasons. Therefore, the experience is at hand. With the likes of Justin Hendricks (.293), Jordan Pollard (.224), Mike Quinonez (.311), Kurtis Kloke (.338), and Cody Swanson (.259), the Cowboys should compete in the CBL. Also returning is starting shortstop Branden Becker (.291), outfielder, Andrew Rios (.381), pitchers Andy Hammond (2-1-6; 2.37era), Noah Jones (3-3; 1.48era), and Matt Acosta (4-1; 2.35era). Those whom are making their first appearance on the varsity squad are juniors: Angel Becerra, Andrew Estrada, Shawn Neal, and Kyle Schepper; sophomores: Zachary Grande and Taylor Sims. The prediction for the crown of the CBL has Redlands as the favorite but Redlands East Valley and Yucaipa are consistently good and will be again, while Cajon is a sleeper.

The CBL consist of a freshman program but Cajon will only have a junior varsity team. Therefore, having a large group of freshman on the JV team will be a challenge facing those with a great deal more sophomores and juniors. However, with the likes of returners: Tony Nunez, Logan Gopperton, Andrew Pina, Jesse Shafer, Jacob Lopez, Mario Espinoza, Jacob Gardner, Teddy Albert, and newcomers: Russell Montana, Gabriel Gordillo, Eric Nunez, Justin Henry, Gabriel Martin, John Maroda, Mikael Bunse, Anthony Lozano, Mason Corneliussen, Gilbert Abarca, Ryan Bunse, and Brandon Avila they will Act Big, Breathe Big, and Commit Big in order to succeed in the CBL and capture the title.

BASEBALL UMPIRE SIGNALS



- A. Right arm straight out front with palm outward and fingers up. This signifies do not pitch, the ball is dead.
- B. Beckoning motion with right hand at head level while facing pitcher. This signifies play is to start or be resumed and simultaneously umpire calls "Play."
- C. Both hands open above the head. Signifies time-out or ball is dead immediately.
- D. Left fist extended to the side at shoulder height. This signifies an infraction for which (1) the penalty may be ignored, or (2) bases may be awarded after no further advance is possible. Examples are: (a) catcher obstruction or umpire interference and (b) fielder's illegal use of equipment in checking a ball and obstruction by a fielder.
- E. Strike. Fist up and away from body.
- F. Infield Fly. Index finger of right hand is held above the head.
- G. Out. Right hand extends out as if to shake hands and continues

- upward to right angle with closed fist slightly forward from the body. Coordinate with verbal call, "He's out," with the hammering action of the closed fist.
- H. Safe. Hands should rise and extend in front of the body to shoulder height. Arms will then move in front of the body to each side of the body in continuous motion. Coordinate verbal call, "safe," with outward extension of the arms.
- I. Fair Ball. Point toward fair ground with open hand.
- J. Foul Tip. The palms of the hands glance off each other as they pass above eye level.
- K. Foul ball. Hands above the head, then with both hands in motion to foul territory.
- L. Place two fingers on the right hand on the left wrist, as if one top of a watch. This signal will only be used in two-out situations where a time play involving a potential run is likely.

Yucaipa breaks out bats, rallies past Cajon

SAN BERNARDINO - An old baseball axiom is that good pitching beats good hitting. On the other hand, when the pitchers are struggling and the fielders are fumbling about, it's nice to have some players who can wield the aluminum. That's what Yucaipa had on Thursday as it overcame an early four-run deficit to defeat Cajon 11-8. The Thunderbird victory, in balmy temperatures before a standing-room-only crowd of 550, came in the opening round of CIF-Southern Section Division II playoffs.

"I'm getting too old for this," Yucaipa coach Jeff Stout said only half-kiddingly after relief pitcher P.J. Jimenez set down the Cowboys in order in the seventh to end the game. "We had too many walks and made some errors, but the one thing we've been able to do all year long is hit. And we did that again today." Yucaipa (20-9) is sixth in the state with 30 home runs, but they didn't hit any Thursday. However, the Thunderbirds hit four doubles, two by Jason Dabbs and one each by Jordan Opdyke and Kent Walton.

Dabbs, who had three hits and one run batted in, said his team was not overly concerned when Cajon stormed to an early lead against Yucaipa starting pitcher Kenny Elifritz. "We've been behind before and come back, so we weren't worried," Dabbs said. "We can swing the bats."

Trailing 6-5, Dabbs opened the fifth by drawing a walk from Cajon left-hander Keith Pezant. It opened the flood gates. Eleven batters came to the plate in the inning, and five of the first six reached base and scored. A key play came after Cajon coach Jon Austin, with runners on second and third and one out, ordered Pezant to intentionally walk Yucaipa catcher Jordan Opdyke. Pezant then induced Kyle McCabe to ground the ball to Cajon shortstop James Koerner's right. But Koerner's throw to start a potential double play went past second baseman Julian Ordaz, and two runners scored. Cajon faced a major rebuilding job after beating Yucaipa for the 2004 San Andreas League title in Yucaipa's last year in the league. It managed to tie San Gorgonio for the SAL title, just as Yucaipa tied A.B. Miller in the Citrus Belt League. Opdyke backed Dabbs' big effort with two hits, and Walton had one hit and a sacrifice fly. Kyle Robinson did a workmanlike job in relief of a struggling Elifritz, and Jimenez retired eight of the nine batters he faced.

Mike Shoemaker made several nice plays in right field for Yucaipa, including a fine running catch in foul territory. The Thunderbirds will have their hottest pitcher available next game. Josiman Hernandez had to sit out the Cajon game for disciplinary reasons, Stout said, but probably will start the Thunderbirds' second-round game.

Ryan Ramones led Cajon with three hits, and Koerner had two hits and two RBI.

Cajon 11, San Gorgonio 2

With two on and nobody out in the fifth inning of a tie game Tuesday, San Gorgonio High School baseball coach Bill Eatinger didn't want to face Cajon star Aaron Brooks. So after a wild pitch by Alex Rueda advanced runners to second and third and left first base open, Eatinger decided that he'd rather face Cajon junior Brandon Swanson than Brooks, who had already homered and doubled. That strategy didn't work for the Spartans, as Swanson stroked a two-run single to center field, setting the stage for a six-run Cajon inning and an eventual 11-2 triumph at Cajon High School. "You definitely don't want to face Brooks in that situation, but you don't want to face Swanson either," Eatinger said. "We decided that we should play the percentages, put ourselves in position to get an out at any base." Swanson, a junior who has moved up from the No. 7 spot in the order toward the top of the inning because of his hot bat, killed that plan - helping deliver an undisputed San Andreas League title to the Cowboys (21-3, 13-1). The title is Cajon's third in four seasons, but the first undisputed title since 1997, as the Cowboys shared the title with San G in 2005 and last season. "I told the guys to cherish this, because it doesn't happen very often," Cajon coach Jon Austin said. "It's not easy to win an undisputed league title. We only had three in the history of the school before (Tuesday) so it's something that they should be proud of." Justin Martinez essentially clinched the title later in the inning, cranking a three-run home run to put the Cowboys up 8-2 and on their way to avenging their only league loss. But it was Swanson's clutch hit that really opened up the floodgates. "I pretty much figured that they were going to walk Aaron," Swanson said. "I knew it was going to be up to me to come through. That's all I was concentrating on." You couldn't blame the Spartans for passing on a showdown with Brooks though. The senior pitcher had accounted for both Cajon runs at that point, driving in Bryce Koleszar with a first-inning double and smashing a solo homer to left in the third. San G (18-6, 10-4) answered both runs, with Andy Crowley scoring on a throwing error in the third and Rueda hitting a solo home run in the fourth.

Those runs weren't enough for San G, who will likely end up as the No. 3 seed from the SAL in the playoffs, as they will lose the tiebreaker with Arroyo Valley (15-7, 10-4) if the two teams tie for second behind Cajon.

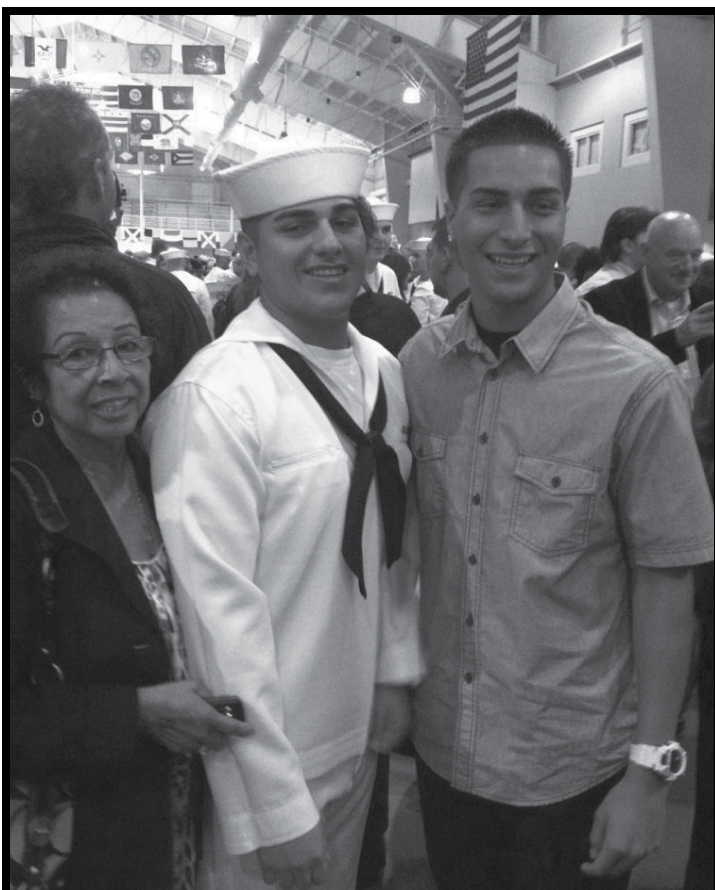
Cajon 7, San Gorgonio 3

Condors drop Cowboys, 4-2 Cajon finally figured out how to attack Whittier California High School pitcher Tyler Leibert in the seventh inning. By then, it was too late. The Condors pulled the upset of the No. 3-ranked Cowboys in the first round of the CIF-SS Division III playoffs Thursday, using pinpoint pitching and opportunistic hitting to topple Cajon, 4-2. "We knew that (Leibert) liked to be aggressive early in the at-bat, get ahead in the count," Cajon coach Jon Austin said. "We figured that we had a good enough lineup to combat that strategy. "Halfway through the game, we realized it wasn't working and told the guys to take a few pitches. It worked better, but it's my fault we didn't go to that strategy earlier." Cajon (22-4) didn't have a runner get past second until the final inning, when Justin Martinez's two-run home run cut the four-run California lead in half. Prior to the three-hit seventh, the Cowboys only managed three hits in the first six innings. "He has a really good, slow change-up that was hard to pick up," said Martinez, who scored Cameron McCullough with his homer. "It took us a while to get comfortable but we did better late. It wasn't enough though." Martinez's home run gave the Cowboys a burst of energy, a burst that swelled when Aaron Ramos reached on an infield single one batter later. Learn the Lingo

Ace -- A team's best starting pitcher

Alley -- The section of the outfield between the outfielders. Also gap."

Around the horn -- A double play going from third base to second to first.

Backdoor slider -- A pitch that appears to be out of the strike zone, but then breaks back over the plate.

Baltimore chop -- A ground ball that hits in front of home plate (or off of it) and takes a large hop over the infielder's head.

Bandbox -- A small ballpark that favors hitters.

Bang-bang play -- A play in which the baserunner hits the bag a split-second before the ball arrives or vice versa. -

Basket catch - -When a fielder catches a ball with his glove near belt level.

Bronx cheer - - When the crowd boos.

Brushback -- A pitch that nearly hits a batter.

Bush -- Also "bush league." An amateur play or behavior.

Can of corn -- An easy catch by a fielder.
Caught looking -- When a batter is called out on strikes.

Cellar -- Last place. Also "basement."

Cheese -- Also "good cheese." Refers to a good fastball.

Chin music -- A pitch that is high and inside.

Circus catch -- An outstanding catch by a fielder.

Closer -- A team's relief pitcher who finishes the game.

Cycle -- when a batter hits a single, double triple and home run in the same game.

Dinger -- A home run.

Dish -- Home plate.

Fireman -- A team's closer or late-inning relief pitcher.

Fungo -- A ball hit to a fielder during practice. A coach using a "fungo bat," which is longer and thinner than a normal bat, usually hits it.

Gap -- See "alley." A ball hit here is a "gapper."

Gopher ball -- A pitch hit for a home run as in "go for."

Heat -- A good fastball. Also "heater."

High and tight -- Referring to a pitch that's up in the strike zone and inside

Hill -- Pitcher's mound.

Homer -- A home run. Other terms include: blast, dingers dong, four-bagger, four-base knock, moon shot, tape-measure blast and tater.

Hot corner - - Third base.

In the hole - - The batter after the on-deck hitter.

Jam -- When a hitter gets a pitch near his hands, he is "Jammed." Also when a pitcher gets himself in trouble, he is In a "jam."

Leather -- Refers to how good a player plays defensively or handles the glove. Ex: "He flashed some leather, on that play,"

Linea - - a very hard hit ball

Meatball -- An easy pitch to hit, usually right down the Middle of the plate.

Mendoza line -- A batting average of around .200.

Moon shot - - A very long, high home run.

Nail down - - As in "nail down a victory." Refers to a relief pitcher finishing off the game.

On the screws -- When a batter hits the ball hard. Also "on the button."

Painting the black -- When a pitcher throws the ball over the edge of the plate.

Pea -- A ball traveling at high speed, either batted or thrown.

Pepper -- Pepper is a common pre-game exercise where one player bunts brisk grounders and line drives to a group of fielders who are standing about 20 feet away. The fielders try to throw it back as quickly as possible. The batter hits the return throw.

Pick -- A good defensive play by an infielder on a ground ball. Also a shortened version of "pick-off."

Pickle -- A rundown.

Punchout -- A strikeout.

Rhubarb -- A fight or scuffle.

Ribbie -- Another way of saying RBI. Also "ribeye."

Rope -- A hard line drive hit by a batter. Also "frozen rope."

Rubber game -- The deciding game of a series.

Run-down -- When a base-runner gets caught between bases by the fielders.

Ruthian -- With great power.

Seeing-eye single -- A soft ground ball that finds its way between infielders for a base hit.

Set-up man -- A relief pitcher who usually enters the game in the 7th or 8th inning.

Shoestring catch -- A running catch made just above the fielder's shoe-tops

Southpaw -- A left-handed pitcher.

Sweet spot -- The part of the bat just a few inches from the barrel.

Table setter -- Batter whose job is to get on base for other hitters to drive him in. Usually a leadoff or No. 2 hitter.

Tape-measure blast -- An extremely long home run.

Tater -- A home run. tater.

Texas Leaguer -- A bloop hit that drops between an infielder and outfielder.

Tools of ignorance -- Catcher's equipment.

Touch 'em all -- Hitting a home run (touching all the bases).

Twin killing -- A double play.

Uncle Charlie - - Curve ball.

Utility player - - A player who fills in at many positions.

Wheelhouse - - A hitter's power zone. Usually a pitch waist-high and over the heart of the plate.

Wheels -- A ballplayer's legs.

Whiff -- Strikeout.

Yakker -- Curve ball.



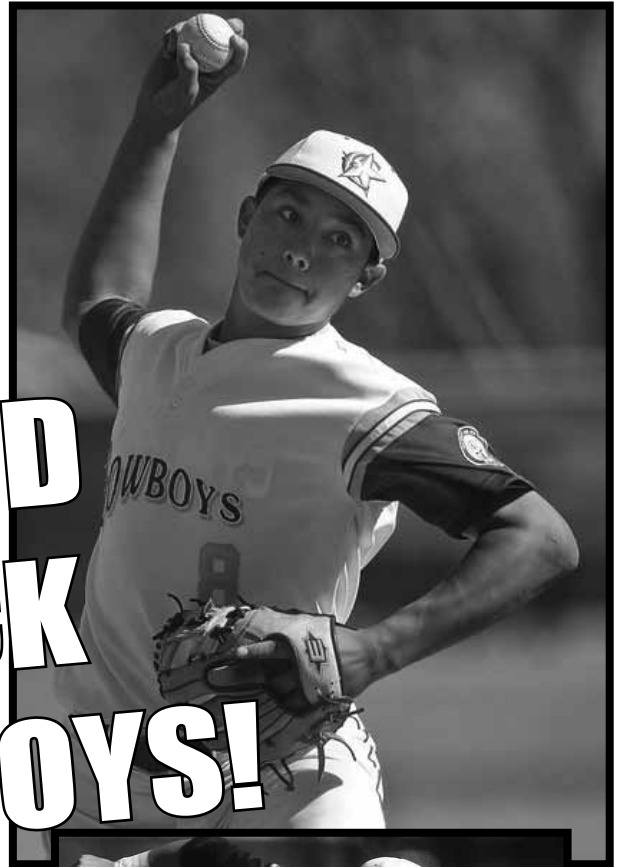
