

Smoking Policy – Jaycee Slo-Pitch Park, CMLC Slo-Pitch League

Bylaw # 23M2018

Tobacco Reduction Act

Under the Tobacco Reduction Act, smoking is not permitted in public premises and workplaces.

Smoking and Vaping Tobacco is prohibited:

Consumption of Tobacco (smoking or vaping) is strictly prohibited in any form on Jaycee Slo-Pitch Park playfields or with-in 5 meters of play fields or playgrounds.

Bylaw # 23M2018

- In a public premise, a workplace
- In, on or with-in 5 meters of a:
 - Sports Field
 - Playground
- To which the public has access as of right by expressed or implied invitation: with-in 5 meters of an entrance or exit to a public premise.

Jaycee Slo-Pitch Park / CMLC League:

Any person in violation of said Smoking Policy will be given a warning and asked to extinguish their cigarette. If another violation occurs, they will be asked to leave the facility for 24-hours from the time of the violation.

- If multiple violations occur, the team will forfeit their games for the night of the violation and additional suspensions and/or fines will result.

Tournaments, Events:

Any person in violation of said Smoking Policy will be given a warning and asked to extinguish their cigarette. If another violation occurs, they will be immediately removed from the facility for the duration of the event.

- The tournament event director or committee will also be responsible for dealing with violators and must abide by this policy, no exceptions.
- Person(s) must be immediately asked to leave park property and be notified they cannot return for the remainder of the event.
- If the tournament director and/or committee refuse to abide or enforce this policy, the tournament and/or event may be cancelled and will forfeit all monies paid.

This is a City of Calgary Bylaw this facility must adhere to; persons can smoke outside the facility gates as long as they are 5 meters from the playfields.

Stations will be at the main entrances of the facility so to put out and discard you used butts, do not leave the butts or such on the ground, violators asked to leave the facility.
