Agenda:

The meeting was called to order by President Mike Hogan at 7:10 PM commencing with the Pledge of Allegiance followed by a moment of silence for those men and women serving in the Armed Forces.

Awards: Vice President Anne Fahey presented the 2024 Junior High Official of the Year Award to Kate Gordon.

Interpretation: Interpreter Kamal Pasha conducted the Rules Interpretation in preparation of the 2024-25 SBWBO Basketball Season. This is not a rule change year, but there are mechanics changes and State recommended Points of emphasis for 2024-25 : as follows

Enforcement of Rules as written: Consistency in enforcement amongst officials is paramount. State is coming down hard on wearing earrings. Band-Aids over earrings are no longer permitted. Officials have authority to request a player remove band-aid, a refusal, athlete not allowed to play. This rule is exclusive to basketball. Kamal will articulate rule at Coaches Meeting. Not a new rule, but a point of emphasis this season **Jewelry:** Jewelry has been prohibited since 1985. No technical if observed during play. Blow whistle, remove play from court, explain offense and request a sub

Screening: State emphasizing officials are missing calls specifically on roll screens.

Traveling: To become proficient in identifying a traveling violation is best facilitated by witnessing plays; specifically reffing often. Be cognizant of players' pivot foot: Pre dribble travel, split foot, players are lifting pivot foot during spin moves to basket. Watching and identifying pivot foot. A post player making a move to the basket may lift a pivot foot if they don't put it back down.

Legal Guarding Position: Ref the defense, watch the defender. There is no time and distance. If the defender has feet planted. Defender can move left, right, up (verticality) obliquely on an angle, backwards just can not move forward.

Post -Play- 3 seconds in lane, Post players can not straddle line into paint both feet must be outside the lane.

Contact on ball handler/dribbler: Defender permitted to measure up with hand on offensive player, remove it and can't put it back on. (Hot Stove) Arm bar or two hands on offensive player-automatic foul, Defender body contact or body bumping, leaning into torso of dribbler which affects, rhythm speed quickness is a foul. (RSBQ) Rhythm! speed !balance! quickness !Collapsed arm bar not a foul.

Technical Fouls: Officials should be less hesitant to "t" someone up by factoring ratings in their decision. Remember, players often emulate their coaches' behavior.

Clamping: Not a new rule. Be able to determine who is the first player to bring hand up to clamp. Watch players off the ball step back for a better angle. Clamping often occurs when ball is on the way to the basket.

Modifications: Three point area now 19'9"

Restricted Area: NYS has not adopted the restricted area rule. But is area located directly under basket.refusal to remove band aid or jewelry will be prohibits competition

Color of Ball- Game may be played with non-orange ball. For example in recognition of breast cancer awareness can use a different colored ball or pink ball.

Players Equipment: Hair adornments beads may be worn provided they are tightly secured and do not pose safety hazards to players on either team.

Officials Jurisdiction: Officials shall arrive 15 minutes proper to start of game and must remain on floor once jurisdiction begins

Shot Clock Displays: If one shot clock not functioning allow competition with just one with an alternative timing device at table. There is no advantage or disadvantage because both teams will be using both timing devices. Foul or intentional kick ball with 14 seconds or less will reset to 15. Shot clock reset to 30 seconds when ball strikes ring or flange, change in possession and all fouls. Except: double fouls where shot time remains.

Uniforms: A team can have every number up to 99. May have "0" or "00" but never both. Verbalize numbers to table. Hold up fingered numbers by face.

10 Second backcourt- No longer 10 second count manually. Utilize shot clock, if shot clock not available use game clock. .

Faking a Foul-Head bobbing of offensive player or flopping to simulate illegal contact. First offense to team is a warning. The second time team fakes fouls will be Team technical foul. Do not stop play, signal it and report later. Communicate with partner you observed a faking of foul. Offensive faking of foul blow whistle right away.

Length Of Quarters: Playing time for JV and Varsity (4) eight minute quarters. One minute intermission between quarter 1&2 and 3&4 , with ten minutes half time

Over time -4 minutes

Time Outs Granted: each team entitled (4) full time outs and (2) thirty 30 second timeouts. OT team awarded an additional 30 second TO
