The following rules are TBWSC specific; if a rule is not indicated below refer to OSA, CSA, or FIFA Laws of the Game for additional clarification.

REGISTRATION	PLAYERS MUST BE REGISTERED TO PARTICIPATE, NO EXCEPTIONS.
REGISTRATION	Players must register with SNO and forward their DOB, team name, and SNO
	registration confirmation receipt to tbwsc.registrar@gmail.com a MINIMUM of 48 HOURS prior to a game for the registrar to obtain an OSA membership for that player to
	be eligible to participate. Only players who have an OSA membership are eligible to
GAME SHEETS	play. Game sheets will be uploaded to the TBWSC for team managers to access. Team
GAME SHEETS	managers are required to:
	1. Print the game sheet
	2. Fill in game date, time, and location
	3. Correct any player names/jersey numbers
	4. Bring the game sheet to the field and give to the referee
	Team managers must cross off any players (line through name) who are absent and add any pick up player information.
	All game officials (referee and scorekeeper) must clearly print and sign their names on the game sheet where indicated.
	Referees/Scorekeepers will mark the score, goal scorers, cards, & discipline on the game sheets.
	Scorekeeper will email/text a picture of the completed form to the Referee Coordinator and to tbwsc.statistics@gmail.com with the date in the subject line.
	Team officials asking questions about League specific rules can be referred to the Laws of the Game/TBWSC Constitution on the TBWSC website.
PLAYER ELIGIBILITY	Team officials are solely responsible for ensuring the eligibility of a player. In the event that a team is suspected of playing an ineligible player that may or may not be listed on the game sheet, the Director of Registration & Statistics will verify whether the player is eligible or not with the current TBWSC registration and OSA records.
	If the player is found to be ineligible, then the team in question will be notified via email of the offence and that they will be fined an equivalent amount to the SNO registration fee. If the team in question won the game, then the team will also forfeit the game by a score of 1-0 in addition to being fined.

PICK-UPS	For the first half of the 25-26 season, when there is one division, no pick-ups are permitted. After one round of play, the following rules apply:
	For the second half of the season, teams are permitted a lateral movement of players, divisions won't be ranked. Pickups are permitted to assist a team in need of subs. Teams are permitted to pick up a max. of three players to provide them a maximum of 3 subs (indoor). This includes rostered players and pickups. Goalies are included as one of the three pickups.
	All pick-ups must be added to the game sheet; if this cannot be completed then this information must be emailed to tbwsc.registrar@gmail.com within 12 hours of the game.
	If a team uses pick-up player(s), rostered players on the host team, if present, must receive fair playing time.
	All pick-ups (name and jersey number) must be added to the game sheet prior to the beginning of the game.
CAUTION SUMMARY/ MISCONDUCT REPORTS	Within 48 hours a Caution Summary Report Form must be submitted for EACH caution/dismissal. The report must be emailed to the TBWSC Referee Coordinator along with the relevant game sheet.
122 3113	Misconduct must be reported, in writing, to the TBWSC within ninety days of the occurrence. All misconduct cases relating to teams registered with the TBWSC will be handled by the TBWSC.
	If any type of misconduct is directed towards the referee, then the referee may abandon the game. An incident report must be filled out (must include reason for abandoning the game) and placed in the locked Referee Office at the Chapples SNO building.
	Specific cases may be referred to SNO or the OSA. If SNO or the OSA deems that such referrals are valid, it will handle the case. If the referral is deemed to be invalid, then the case will be handled by the TBWSC.
DISCIPLINE	Bullying, swearing, unsportsmanlike behaviour, and any other behavior deemed inappropriate by the team or game officials will be dealt with as outlined in the MISCONDUCT REPORTS section.
DURATION OF GAME	6 v 6, including goalie. Games will run for two, 25 minute halves, with a maximum of a 5 minute break at half-time.
GAME CANCELLATIO N	If the Tournament Centre is closed for any reason, the TBWSC website will be updated as soon as possible regarding any cancellations and team reps will be notified if possible. Club members must check the TBWSC website on game days for updated field information.
	TEAMS MUST SHOW UP AT THE FIELD TO PLAY AS SCHEDULED UNLESS NOTIFIED PRIOR TO THE GAME.

TIE BREAKERS	Regular season games may end in a tie.
	Play-off games will go straight to penalty kicks if tied after regulation time.
SUBSTITUTION	6v6 - Unlimited, on-the-fly substitutions. Goalie substitutions must be made at stoppage time and with permission of the referee.
	Substitutions must be made within five (5) metres of the halfway line running along the touch line by each team's beach.
# OF PLAYERS	6v6 - A minimum of four (4) players are required per team to start and maintain a game. Failure to meet this requirement on the part of an individual team will result in that team automatically forfeiting the game by a score of 1-0.
INJURIES	Significant injuries occurring during the game that require medical attention, regardless of whether the game was delayed or an ambulance called must be noted on the game sheet.
	An Accident/Injury Report form https://s3.amazonaws.com/my.llfiles.com/00203835/Accident_IncidentReportForm.pdf must also be filled out and submitted into the locked Referee box at the Chapples SNO Office. A duplicate of the completed form must be placed in the TBWSC mailbox at the Chapples SNO building along with the completed game sheet.
	An injured player can be substituted before the restart of play.
EQUIPMENT	Team members must have complete uniforms: jersey with number, shorts, and socks. Players on a specific team will have identical uniforms, including the same colour jersey, shorts, and socks. Goalies for each team must wear a different colour than their team, the opposing team, and the opposing team's goalie.
	Goalies are not required to have numbered jerseys.
	Players are required to wear shin guards that provide adequate protection and footwear deemed safe for play by the referee.
	Additional clothing may be worn under the uniform at the discretion of the referee provided the clothing colour is consistent among the team.
	Teams are responsible for providing their own pinnies in case of jersey colour conflicts. The original team jersey must be worn under the pinnies.
	Both teams are responsible for bringing a game ball, pump, and pin to each game.
	NO JEWELRY OF ANY KIND MAY BE WORN WHILE PLAYING. TAPING OF JEWELRY IS NOT PERMITTED. Players wearing jewelry will be asked to leave the playing area until the jewelry is removed.
	Eyeglass strap must be worn by any players wearing glasses.

OFFICIALS	If the referee fails to attend the scheduled game, the teams, if mutually agreeable, can appoint a referee. The game sheets will be collected by the winning team, or, in the case of a tie, the home team, and a picture of the game sheets will be sent to the TBWSC Referee Coordinator. The game sheets will be verified and signed by both team representatives.
FAIR PLAY	The TBWSC encourages and supports fair play; the TBWSC promotes and endorses the mandate of Fun, Fitness, and Friendship for all League participants.
