Appeals

APPEAL TYPES

Batting out of order

Checked swings

Base running

BASE RUNNING APPEALS

- An appeal must be clearly intended as an appeal
 - Verbal
 - Unmistakable act
 - No "accidental" appeals
- An accidental appeal does not count as a play
- If more than one runner is involved in the appeal, the defense must declare on which player the appeal is being made.

STATUS OF THE BALL

- NFHS: either live or dead ball is legal.
 - An invalid dead ball appeal does not cancel the right to an appeal
 - Dead ball- coach or player can state the infraction
 - Live ball- play must be made

STATUTE OF LIMITATIONS

- An appeal must be made
 - Prior to the next pitch
 - Prior to attempted play initiated by the defense
- Prior to the defense leaving the field
 - Infielders and pitcher crossing the foul lines

NEGATED APPEALS

- The defense initiates a play
- Pitcher balks
- The ball is thrown out of play
- Erroneous throw if it leaves live ball territory or is not immediately returned to the base being appealed or runners advance on the misplay

FOURTH OUT APPEAL

- The appeal may be a "fourth out" and will then take precedence over the third
- It may nullify runs scored
- The defense has the preference if more than one appeal can be made

MECHANICS

- Tag up from third
 - Plate umpire has both ends
 - The tag is the priority
 - The play at the plate is next
 - Move into position to line up catch and tag
 - Easy on the left
 - Difficult on the right
