


The Balk




DEFINITION

- Rule 2-3:
 - —A balk is an illegal act committed by the pitcher with a runner(s) on base which entitles each runner to advance one base.
 - -What's missing?




...ILLEGAL ACT WITH A RUNNER(S) ON BASE

- There must be a runner or runners on base
- There must be an illegal act.
 - -Rule 6
 - 1-1-4: Inferred rather than itemized
 - 2-4-a-f: List form
 - Common balks?




To Call A Balk You Have To See It

- Responsibilities
 - The NFHS rules do not distinguish which umpire is responsible for calling a balk
 - -The NFHS Umpires Manual does not assign
 - mechanics responsibilities to specific umpires
 - —How are we supposed to get it right?




CCA- PLATE UMPIRE GUIDELINES

- Left-handed pitchers stepping to home plate
- Left-handed pitchers coming to a complete stop
- Right-handed pitchers coming to a complete stop
- Right-handed pitchers stepping to the plate on the third-to-first move
- Right-handed pitchers gaining ground on a jump turn
- Right-handed pitchers closing their front shoulder before the jump turn



CCA- BASE UMPIRE GUIDELINES

- Left-handed pitchers coming to a complete stop
- Right-handed pitchers breaking their front knees before the jump turn
- Right-handed pitchers gaining ground on the jump turn



NORTHEAST UMPIRES ASSOCIATION?

- Plate
 - Upper body?
- Base
 - Lower body?
- Anyone?...Beuller?....Bueller?

In any case, once a balk is seen and called, the ball is dead immediately and one—base awards are made accordingly.

There is <u>NO</u> award to the batter.
