HOW IT WORKS

To ensure that all Crow River Baseball association are in compliance with federal and state laws, all head coaches, assistant coaches, and any adult who will participate with, or have authority over youth athletes are required to comply with the information below:

- Concussion training is required by Minnesota law for all umpires, coaches and bench personnel involved in youth sports (paid and volunteer). The certificate is good for three years.
- The "Safe Sport Authorization Act of 2017" was signed into federal law on February 14, 2018. This training is to be done on a annual basis.
- Federal background checks are to be done on a annual basis.


FACE COVERINGS

- League play :
 - A minimum of 7 players is required to begin a game or to continue a game. Automatic outs for the 8th and/or 9th spots in the batting order. CHANCE: UNLESS BOTH COACHES MUTUALLY AGREE NOT TO TAKE THE AUTOMATIC OUT(S) FOR THE OPEN SPOT(S) IN THE ORDER.
 - New pitchers may take up to (7) seven warmup pitches in the half inning. Returning
 pitchers may take up to (5) warm up pitcher in the half inning.

Tournament play:

- 14A & 12A games are 6 innings. 10A games are 5 innings. 1:40 time limit.
- 12AA, 11AA, 10AA games are 6 innings with 1:40 time limit.
- 13AA & 14AA games are 7 innings with 2:00 time limit.
- No time limit in the championship game. Run rule remains in effect.



LEAGUE RULE CHANGES

- 14AA & 13AA = 95/day; 160/tournament
- 12AA & 11AA = 85/day; 150/tournament
- 10AA = 75/day; 140/tournament
- 14A = 3 innings per game
- 12A = 2 innings per game (may pitch 3 if 7-innings are played)

PITCH LIMITS

IOA = 2 innings per game



- **14AA, 13AA:** Metal cleats are permitted.
- All ages: Bat the bench is mandatory. Minimum of two (2) innings on defense per player is mandatory.
- All ages: 7 run limit per inning except the last inning.
- All ages: Infield fly rule is in effect.
- **14AA, 13AA, 12AA:** dropped 3rd strike is in effect.
- **11AA, 10AA:** D3K the batter is out and may not advance. Baserunners may attempt to advance.

'AA' RULE REMINDERS

- 11AA: Runners may not leave the base until the ball leaves the pitcher's hand. (dead ball out)
- **10AA:** Runners may not leave the base until the ball crosses home plate. (dead ball out)
- **10AA:** A balk is a "no pitch". Explain with no penalty.



- **14A:** Metal cleats are permitted.
- All ages: Bat the bench is mandatory. Minimum of two (2) innings on defense per player is mandatory.
- All ages: 5 (five) run limit per inning for the first five (5) innings.
- All ages: Infield fly rule is in effect.
- **14A, 12A:** dropped 3rd strike is in effect.
- **10A:** D3K the batter is out and may not advance. Baserunners may attempt to advance.
- **10A:** Runners may not leave the base until the ball crosses home plate. (dead ball out)
- **10A:** Stealing 2B & 3B is permitted. Runners may not steal home.
- **12A, 10A:** A balk is a "no pitch". Explain with no penalty.
- **10A:** Each coach can decide for their team whether to play three (3) or four (4) outfielders.
- **12A:** The home team may decide whether the game will be played with four (4) outfielders.

'A' RULE REMINDERS



WEATHER RELATED

- 7 days to reschedule.
- If neither coach attempts to reschedule, it will be a forfeit for both teams.
- Keep and email trail of communication.
- Contact your director if a coach isn't responding.
- If one coach is trying to set a date and the other will not agree, it will result in a win/forfeit.



NON-WEATHER RELATED

- The opposing coach has the option to take the win.
- When a new date is agreed upon it becomes THE date of the game.
- Please make every effort to play the games for the boys.



MAKEUP GAMES



- The league will not cancel play due to extreme heat.
- Take proper precautions to ensure player safety.
- Keep cold towels in coolers with ice.
- Make sure players are drinking water in days leading up to the anticipated heat, as well as during games.
- Players need to be prepared to play a number of games in the heat during tournament play.



HEAT INDEX

- Report your scores on a weekly basis.
- Update your schedule if a game is cancelled/postponed/forfeited.
- Contact the opposing coach if a game is canceled for any reason (75 minute rule).
- Reply in a timely manner to opposing coaches about reschedules.
- Ensure that your players have legal and safe equipment.
- Ensure that your field is properly groomed and ready for play.
- Ensure that your players are having a GREAT EXPERIENCE!







COACH RESPONSIBILITY

• Set the example for your players and fans with proper behavior.



- Fight for your players in the proper manner. Maintain control and respect.
- Make sure that your body language and words are not demeaning or threatening. This is determined by the other person.
- You are teaching your players how to treat umpires as well as other authority figures.
- Your fans will take your lead.
