Yes, he can go into the game. (Rule 3, Section 6E) CASTS/PROSTHESIS: All casts and splints must be padded. Prosthesis may be worn. Braces with exposed hard surfaces must be padded. Any of this equipment, judged by the umpire to be potentially dangerous, is illegal. Any decision by the umpire should be based on whether or not a device worn or used by an individual with a disability changes the fundamental nature of the game or poses a significant risk to the welfare of other players.
