

Ministry expands with help from five Area Leaders

In 2011, we began a new leadership level that allows Seed Ministry to grow and reach children in areas never before possible. This is a strategic change from more centralized management. We prayerfully and carefully select new leaders who have significant responsibilities.



Meet our Area Leaders.

Steven Liibi—Salaga Area

We first received a phone call from Steven about four years ago, saying he had heard about the work Seed Ministry was doing. He asked if we would come to his area to show them how to start Bible Clubs.

Finally, 2011 brought us to the Salaga Area where there now are 45 Bible Clubs that are attended by more than 1,977 children. Praise God for Steven's perseverance!

David Mbaga—Wale Wale Area

Pastors from Langbinsi started asking Seed Ministry to come there to teach Children's Workers all the way back to 2002. In 2003, they started their first Bible Clubs, and in 2004, the Wungu Bible Club began. Now both communities-along with many others-are combined into the Wale Wale area, where 1,909 children attend 46 Bible Clubs. David and his wife, Lydia, were two of the first Club Leaders.

Paul Abukari— Nyankpala Area

Paul is one of our first Bible Club Leaders, as well as one of the First Zone Leaders when we divided the Clubs into Zones. Paul always exemplified leadership qualities in the way he conducted his Bible Club, Zonal Leader commitments, and his own family. The Nyankpala Area now has 44 Bible Clubs with 1,220 children.

Thomas Saaka— Tamale Area

Another first Bible Club Leader and Zone Leader, Thomas came on staff as Bible Club Overseer in 2004. In 2005, he became our Training Supervisor to facilitate Club Leader Foundation Training. In 2011, his role changed once again, and the Tamale Zone has 50 Bible Clubs with 2,166

Matthew Zeblim-Gushiegu

Matthew worked for Great Commission showing the Jesus Film in the Gushiegu Area for several years. All the while, he asked us to also come to start Bible Clubs. In 2011, we did the first of three Foundation Trainings and now have 21 Bible Clubs with 834 children.
