

Servant Spotlight by Rebecca Glunt

"I know your deeds, that you are neither cold nor hot. I wish you were either one or the other! So, because you are lukewarm-neither hot nor cold-I am about to spit you out of my mouth" (Revelation 3:15-16). This is taken from the favorite passage of scripture of David Phenis in the letter to the church in Laodicea. David and Martina Phenis will be married for 14 years in May. They have two children Makenzie 12 years old and Caden 9 years old, respectively. They have been members of FCC Lynn for about 8 years. David graduated from Winchester CHS in 1991 and Martina graduated from Winchester CHS in 1996. In 2006 she graduated from Ivy Tech with an Associates of Applied Science in Medical Assisting. She also received her certification in 2010 for Medical Assisting. Currently, Martina works at Dr. Wegg's office and David works as a Maintenance Technician at Ivy Tech. Martina was interested in helping people from an early age as evidenced by her being a Candy Striper at Reid Hospital around her junior high and early high school years.

In the church, Martina teaches Sunday school to 1st-2nd grade children, works in the nursery, and helps with preparing the communion for Sunday mornings.
