

Servant Spotlight by Rebecca Glunt

"For God so loved the world that He gave His one and only Son, that whoever believes in Him shall not perish but have eternal life (John 3:16)." This is the favorite verse of Mary Alice Clements. She cites that this love is sacrificial. Mary Alice says that this verse is particularly meaningful saying, "It has to be a different kind of love, that's for everyone."

Mary Alice was married to her late husband Wilbur for 56 years until his passing in 2005 from cancer. They began going to First Church of Christ and were baptized in 1955. Joe and Jewel Cross introduced them to the church. Mary Alice and her husband had two children; Connie and Rex. She has five grandchildren; three girls and two boys. Mary Alice also has nine great grandchildren. She graduated from McKinley High School outside of Winchester in 1946. Wilbur graduated from Lynn High School in 1945. Wilbur farmed corn, soybeans, and wheat. Mary Alice helped on the farm driving the tractor and other related jobs on the farm. They also raised hogs.

In the church, Mary Alice has counted the offering and worked in the nursery in the past. She has also prepared communion, taught some in Sunday School classes for children, and has helped prepare funeral dinners. She also used to help with the annual church cleaning. Wilbur served as a deacon in the church. In the community, he served on the Randolph Southern school board for about four years in the past.

Something that you may not know about Mary Alice and her husband Wilbur was that they used to be a part of the <u>BiState Steppers</u>, which was a western style square dancing club. They would go to the Lynn Fair, county fairs, and to nursing homes, performing their square dancing. Mary Alice still belongs to the Rural Couples Club. They meet one time a month. She has belonged to this club for about 56 years.

The hymn <u>Amazing Grace</u> is Mary Alice's favorite hymn. Some words that this writer believes are meaningful to all believers are from this hymn, "Amazing grace how sweet the sound that saved a wretch like me. I once was lost but now am found; was blind but now I see."
