

What Scares You?

Decades ago the city of London was in the midst of what was considered for them the darkest days of World War II. The city was getting bombed almost daily by the enemy and the people of London were in fear for their very lives. At that time Winston Churchill gave a speech to stir the people out of this feeling of defeat and helplessness. He borrowed the words of President Roosevelt and spoke to the Londoners, "The only thing we have to fear is fear itself!"

We are coming upon the 10th anniversary of the terrorist attack on America that occurred on September 11, 2001. Since that fateful day, the leaders of our country and the news media have been continually reminding us that we must be on alert and that we are still in an ongoing "War on Terror," yet encouraging us to remain strong and confident that we may prevail. The Apostle Peter was concerned about the dangers that the early Christians would be faced with and so he also wrote to them to encourage and strengthen them, "But even if you should suffer for the sake of righteousness, you are blessed. AND DO NOT FEAR THEIR INTIMIDATION, AND DO NOT BE TROUBLED," (I Peter 3:14).

For Americans today we certainly need to be, and can't help but be, concerned about the possible dangers we have now in our country from "terrorists" since the day we found out we were not invincible. But especially for us today as Christians, we need to keep all this in the scope of an eternal perspective.

The words from our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, "And do not fear those who kill the body, but are unable to kill the soul; but rather fear Him who is able to destroy both soul and body in hell." (Matt. 10:28). Christ, from this text, has given us a far more important and serious danger that needs to be addressed. There is a judgment that is awaiting all of us, even those who have no concern for religion being a part of our society and even to those enemies we call terrorists from Muslim and Communist countries. This judgment is a fear that should weigh far more on individuals because it is one that our Creator will pronounce as a reward for the soul as to whether eternity will be spent in heaven or hell.

We have a mission that is ever present and important in our lives as Christians. The message we are to take to the world, and that is all the world, including the terrorists as well as the unsaved people everywhere should be this, "...flee from the wrath to come..." (Luke 3:7), and instead seek, "...repentance toward God and faith in our Lord Jesus Christ." (Acts 20:21). We must not sit still on our salvation, but be compelled "For we must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ, that each one may be recompensed for his deeds in the body, according to what he has done, whether good or bad. Therefore knowing the fear of the Lord, we persuade men..." (II Cor. 5:10, 11). So although we have present dangers that concern us in life, we must continue to be the messenger of Christ, His representatives, "Therefore, we are ambassadors for Christ, as though God were entreating through us; we beg you on behalf of Christ, be reconciled to God. He made Him who knew no sin to be sin on our behalf, that we might become the righteousness of God in Him." (II Cor. 5:20, 21).

May we be ever strong and confident persevering through the present dangers to complete the mission left the church by Christ; to seek and bring the lost to God through Christ.


